## An Unhappy Wrangle.

A few nights ago one Mr George W Fowler, of whom the country has heard more than enough of late, appeared at a Conservative love-feast in Montreal and delivered himself of what the Montreal Star is pleased to describe as "one of his most violent paroxysms" and again as an "eruption"—the variant phraseology is immaterial. At this meeting, which was tantamount to a vindication of the bellicose member from New Brunswick, appeared also Mr H B Ames, M P for St. Antoine Division, one of the most censorious critics of the Government. Mr Ames not merely gave public countenance to Mr Fowler by moving a vote of thanks, but he undertook to furnish him with a certificate of character by commending his "straightforward and courageous statements," presumably having reference to his notorious threat in the House of Commons. Hence the Star's attack on Mr Ames. This is the way it proceeds to rend one of the ornaments of the Opposition front benches:

"To insinuate that an opponent is leading an immoral life privately, and then to stubbornly and repeatedly fail to either make good his slander or withdraw it, is Mr Ames' notion of 'straightforwardness and courage.' It will come as a long-awaited piece of news to many of Mr Ames' constituents to learn just where he does stand in this Fowler business. Here was a threatened exposure of immorality on the part of public men. The more courageous of the clergy demanded that the charges be pressed and the country be given an opportunity to purge its public life of men who were said to be disgracing the nation and presenting a degrading example to the youth of the land. Some of us imagined that the ex-President of the Young Men's Christian Association might take a stand on a moral question of this sort. Mr Ames has been regarded by us all as 'the Christian in politics'—the one man who could run a 'machine' on the principles of purity and religion, with the aid of 'cheese and crackers'—and hence we have been looking to him to make this moral issue his own and to insist that his young men of the Y M C A should not be exposed to the contamination of witnessing men in the highest places bowing before insinuations of personal immorality and not being compelled to leave public life in disgrace.

"However, now that we know where Mr Ames stands, it cannot be pretended that we are any the happier. We shall next expect to see him invite his model for 'straightforwardness and courage'—the immaculate Fowler—to accompany him when he addresses words of sweet counsel to the young people of the congregation assembled in some church basement or school room, to which these two politicians are given exclusive access because of their rare fitness. Nor will Mr Ames be at loss for a theme. He will first point out that a 'straightforward' and courageous man is one who hides behind his 'privilege' as a member of Parliament to make insinuations against public men which would expose him to the danger of criminal prosecution if he made them anywhere else, and who then refuses to either prove his statements or withdraw them. Next Mr Ames will pass to 'secondly' in which he will show how he himself is a 'straightforward and courageous man' because he sat silent while Mr Bonrassa was trying with all his might to make Mr Fowler speak; and that moreover he is a champion of morality and a particular guardian of the character of the young men as is shown by his hearty endorsement of a fellow-politician who says that he has 'data' to prove that men in high places in Canada are leading lives to be described in terms of 'women, wine and graft,' but who will make no use of that 'data' to purify our public life, choosing rather to use it as a shield to ward off criticism of his own 'private business.' On the following evening Mr Ames can address another gathering in another church basement on the subject—'A Man is Known by the Company He Keeps.'

The situation grows more than interesting. The Star has already toasted Hon George E Foster to a turn. It has hurled its sharpest darts at Mr Fowler. It has goaded Mr Borden almost to the breaking point and in no gentle way exhorted him to summarily cast out certain of his associates and now it has read the Riot Act to Mr Ames. Verily, these are troublous times for the Opposition. Mr Borden, evidently, must soon make choice between his chief newspaper organ and the discredited politicians who have seized and are determined to hold the high places in the Opposition.—(Halifax Chronicle.)

## WILL KISSING BE PROHIBITED
