

Will Preach Before The King.

Canadian members of the Church of England, particularly those of New Brunswick, have, it is said, been especially honored by the King, in that his Lordship Bishop Richardson, now head of the Diocese of Fredericton, will, it is stated, address a children's service to be held in St Paul's Cathedral, London, during the Pan-Anglican congress, at which His Majesty King Edward VII, who has expressed the desire to hear the youngest bishop in the Anglican communion, will be present.

This fact has been known to a few of the Anglican clergymen for some days, and it is freely stated that Bishop Richardson has been requested to address the children, both because of his ability and eloquence and also because he has the proud distinction of being the youngest bishop in the empire.

His Lordship, with Mrs. Richardson and family, sailed for England on Saturday. Others in the party were the Venerable Archdeacon Raymond, Mrs. Raymond and Venerable Archdeacon Newham.

His Lordship Bishop Richardson

admitted that it was true that he was to address the children in St Paul's Cathedral. He was very reticent, however, and would only add that the invitation had come to him through Bishop Montgomery, secretary of the Society for Propagation of the Gospel. Asked if it was on account of his being the youngest bishop, his lordship said he really did not know.

Another "Reform" Forgotten.

Our present very economical (?) local government, every man of which, used to be shocked to the marrow whenever Pugsley or Tweedie or Jones found it necessary to go to Ottawa on business for the province, seems to be falling into the habit of so severely condemning before reaching the seats of the mighty. Only last week Hon Mr. Hazen and his Surveyor-General boarded the train for Ottawa, ostensibly for the purpose of consulting with the chief authorities of the Transcontinental Railway concerning forest protection, but most likely on a party junketing expedition. The people will cheerfully pay the piper, too.

When Mr. Hazen carries out a single pledge made before reaching office we shall give him due credit. "By their work ye shall know them." It is rather unfortunate for him that so far he has shown every indication of catering to the spoilsman. Although this was not to be a party administration, up to date every single officeholder displaced, deposed or removed has been a graft, and every man appointed to an office of emolument a violent and in most cases impudent Tory partisan.

5,000 Facts About Canada.

Drink Bill of Canada

The last issue of the Canada Year Book, issued by the statistics branch of the Department of Agriculture, gives productions of "liquor and beverages" for 1908 as worth 14,394,319. In the same year these important "spirits" of 2,192,761, and presumably the sum of these two items would give an approximation to the total drink bill of Canada for the year 1908. The same Year Book gives the capital invested in the "liquors and beverages" industry as \$26,639,815. The Statistical Year Book of Canada (a most useful volume whose publication has been discontinued by the Government,) gives the per capita consumption for the year ending June 30, 1904, as follows: Spirits, 0.973 gallons; wine, 0.122; beer, 3.231. The consumption of beer in Great Britain and Ireland for the year 1907 was 33,250,654 barrels of 36 gallons to the barrel; the consumption of wine was 39,283,578 gallons. No estimate of the value is given, but figures of the value of the 1906 drink bill of the United Kingdom are given as £164,167,941. The experience of the Scott Act in the Eastern Provinces where it is in force is that in rural districts it is practically prohibitive; in the urban settlements the act does not operate so successfully.


