### Political Assassinations.

Mr Hazen continues to wield the political axe most vigorously and is really rivalling Whitney of Ontario in the number of officials he has dismissed.

The sheriffs of Restigouche, Kent, Albert and Carleton have been dropped for the sole reason that their places were wanted for hungry followers of Mr Hazen. So far as the public are aware there were no charges of political partisanship against the gentlemen so summarily displaced, and the indecent manner in which they have been treated will probably be a subject of discussion in the legislature.

The new sheriffs, Stewart in Restigouche, Carter in Albert, Johnson in Kent, and Tompkins in Carleton, are all bitter partisans, and Stewart is one of Mr Hazen's defeated candidates in Restigouche.

Mr Hazen has degraded the public service by displacing worthy officials to make room for his own hidebound partisans, and it is worth nothing that in spite of his protestations that he would know no party in the administration of the government, every official he has dismissed up to date is a Liberal and every man he has appointed to office is a Conservative. Mr Morrissey claims to be a Liberal yet he has to stand by and see members of his party slaughtered to make way for Mr Hazen's Tory friends.

The sheriff program, however, was not carried out in its entirety for obvious reasons.

Sheriff Holden of Sunbury, for instance was marked for dismissal but because he is a Roman Catholic and the votes of his co-religionists all being cultivated to Mr Wilmot in the federal election, his head was saved for the present, but will be promptly dropped into the Tory executioner's basket as soon as that contest is over.

Mr Hazen and his Tory friends will probably live to regret their wholesale decapitation of Liberal officials, which is being carried out just to provide places for the hungry persons who have been following the premier with the expectation of office and emolument and not because of any principle or policy which the Tory leader has enunciated, and Mr Hazen will find that for every grafter he appoints to office, ten times as many hungry fellows who must go unrewarded because there are not enough positions to go around, will put the knife into him at the first favorable opportunity.—Herald.


