Calgary's Big Fair.

The people in general seem to have a very meagre idea of what is meant by the term "Dominion Exhibition," and a word or two in explanation may not be out of place. The Dominion Government has, for the past five years, made an annual grant of fifty thousand dollars to be used for the purpose of holding a Dominion Exhibition in some one of the Provinces. These exhibitions have been held in Toronto, Ontario, Winnipeg, Manitoba, New Westminster, British Columbia, Halifax, Nova Scotia, and Sherbrooke, Quebec, and one of the beneficial results was that each of these provinces received a considerable amount of valuable advertising.

In the fall of 1905, those having in charge the Calgary Exhibition, decided to make arrangements with the view of holding the Dominion Exhibition in that city, and made application to the Dominion Government for the grant for 1907. Meantime the energies of the Board were directed toward getting the grounds and buildings in readiness. When it was learned that the Dominion Exhibition was to be held in Sherbrooke, Que., in 1907, the Government was urged to make the grant for the Province of Alberta for 1908, and early in October last, the President and Manager of the Calgary Exhibition went to Ottawa and succeeded in securing the grant, and since that time letters of approval of the move have been received from all parts of the Dominion, and especially from the West, and from every quarter have come assurances of hearty support and co-operation that are very gratifying and encouraging to the officers.

The Dominion grant must be used for certain specific purposes which are: Special and extraordinary prizes; securing and maintaining educational exhibits; equalizing freight rates for exhibits from various parts of the Dominion, and advertising outside of the Province.

The greater cost of management and the necessary outlay for increased accommodation rendered the raising of additional funds a necessity and the Provincial Government of Alberta and the Calgary City Council approached, and it is pleasant to record that they responded promptly, the province making a grant of \$25,000 and the city \$35,000.

The dates selected for the Exhibition are from June 29th to July 9th. Low passenger rates have been arranged from all parts of the country, especially from Eastern Canada, where home seekers excursions have been arranged at a rate of \$40.50 for the return trip, good for two months. Thus enabling visitors to see other points in the province before or after the exhibition. The scarcity with which the people of Alberta have grasped the advantages of the exhibition, is illustrated by the fact that all the space devoted to district exhibits has been taken up, there being nearly 50 to be made; the largest collection ever got together. The provinces of Alberta, Saskatchewan and British Columbia have also been allotted space for exhibits.

Arrangements on a large scale have been made for the accommodation of visitors; all the commodious city schools and the Normal school college having been secured, and will be turned into temporary apartment houses.

The exhibition will be officially opened by Hon Sydney Fisher, Minister of Agriculture in the Dominion Cabinet, and it is expected that several other Dominion Cabinet Ministers will be present, as well as the Lieutenant Governors and Ministers of the Western Provinces.

During the Exhibition, the members of the Masonic Order will hold a fair, in which every member of the Craft on the Continent is interested. The American Association of Calgary have arranged for a giant display on Independence Day, one of the features of which will be the

visit of a large excursion party from Spokane, Washington, under the auspices of the Chamber of Commerce of that city.

The 91st Highlanders Band of Hamilton has been engaged for the fair, and the Lads in the Kilts are sure to be a great attraction especially to the people of Western Canada.

The Iowa State Band will assist in furnishing music during the Exhibition.

The attractions will be equal to anything ever seen in Canada, and there will be many typical Western features not seen at other exhibitions, such as Rough Riding by Real Cow Boys, Indian and Squaw Races by Indians and Squaws from the reserves.

That a large crowd will be in attendance at the exhibition goes without saying. Alberta is in many ways the most interesting province in the Canadian Confederation. The Dominion Exhibition offers an opportunity to see it before the picturesque and fascinating western life of which it has for many years been peculiarly the scene and the epitome, is forced to make its last stand in foot hills by the energetic wheat farmer. The exhibition too offers an opportunity to the Eastern Canadian to become acquainted with the West. It is a common saying in the West, that the East does not know it. There is no likelihood of any great misunderstanding of each other on the part of Western Canada and Eastern Canada in this day of the telegraph, the telephone, the transcontinental train, but there is no denying the fact that a surprising lack of knowledge of the west exists in Eastern Canada. The problem has been, how to see the West cheaply and quickly. The exhibition provides the solution, for while one cannot see the whole province of Alberta in the time limit of his railway ticket, he can see much of it, and the district exhibits at the exhibition will give him an idea of the productiveness and versatility of the province in a satisfactory, and very probably, surprising way.
