Political Topics.

We must apologize to our readers for a piece of misinformation in our last issue. We said that Dr. Bourque M. P. P. had accepted the Conservative nomination in Kent Co., but it seems he did not do such thing, in fact he told the Convention that he did not think it right for a local member to leave his seat and run for Ottawa. We need only mention the fact that we got astray by reading an alleged despatch in the Gleaner, which under a first rate cut of the good looking Doctor, brazenly announced his nomination. Of course under such circumstances it is no wonder we were deceived. We might have known better, but it seems the Frederickton graft organ cannot be trusted even in its news columns. A fair sample of its utter lack of veracity is contained in its account of the Convention at Edmundston which nominated Col. Jesse W. Baker in opposition to Pius Michaud M. P. The Gleaner report said the gathering was one of the largest in the history of the county, but we have it on the word of one of the leading men of Edmundston that there were by actual count only fifteen voters present, and we challenge the Gleaner or anybody else to disprove our statement. Colonel Baker, who was elected last March under a distinct pledge to support the Robinson government, had no sooner landed in Frederickton than he at once went over to the Hazen following, the party with the loaves and fishes. This is the kind of man the people of Victoria and Madawaska are to be asked to send to Ottawa. Colonel Baker will scarcely save his deposit, but supposing for the sake of argument, he should be elected? Where would we find him? Judging by his record he would be found lining up with the party in power, no matter what name they might be called. This is not the sort of representative any constituency in these days can afford to send to Ottawa. Colonel Baker has thrown away the bone, and is in pursuit of the dancing shadow.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

DUTIES.—(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must, notify the Agent for the district of such intention.
