



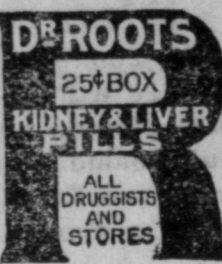

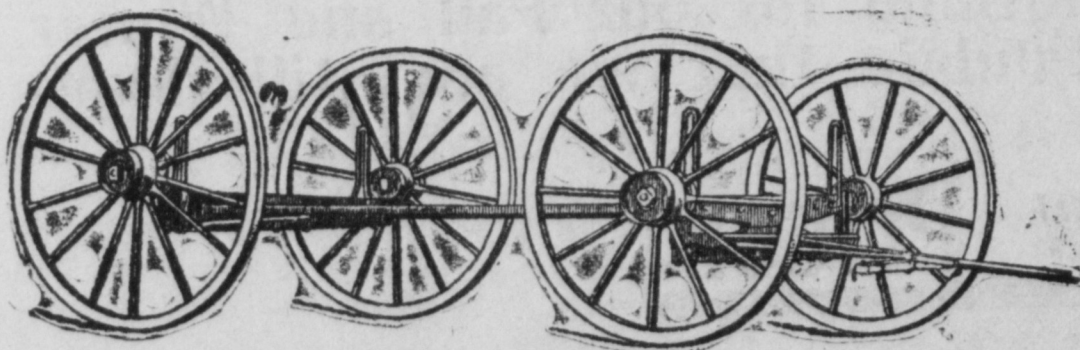

The Champion Middleman.

Mr Foster is saying a great deal about the middleman in politics. And it is fitting that one who knows so much about it should lecture on the subject with which he is best acquainted. For he, truly, is the great original Simon Pure middleman of the country. There are doubtless other middlemen, but where can there be found one who is able to be middleman and both ends at the same time? This is the shining triumph that Mr Foster achieved. In the famous transactions revealed by the inquiry of the Insurance commission the member for North Toronto gave a brilliant illustration of that famous operation known as playing both ends against the middle. Here was the situation: Mr Foster, manager of the Union Trust Company, was the middleman. At the left-hand end was Mr Foster a member of a hastily-formed syndicate. At the right-hand end one discovers the already familiar features of Mr Foster, stockholder in the as hastily-formed Great West Land Company. Mr Foster, the syndicate, has just acquired an option on 200,000 acres of land, which he turns over to Mr Foster, the Wild West man, and the Wild West man in turn loads it on Mr Foster, the middleman. It was only in the character of Mr Foster, the middleman, that he had the money to swing the 200,000 acres of land. In his other roles he was (or were)—it is difficult to suit the grammar—merely an impeccable gentleman waiting for something to turn up. But in his character as the middleman he was in control of a part of the millions piled up by the highly-successful Order of Foresters, and in his other two characters he was able to nominate his profits and found Mr Foster, the middleman, an amiable and complying personage. Mr Foster knows all about middlemen. He is the great champion middle-weight middleman of the Dominion.

Mr Hazen and the Valley Line.

In apology for his failure to make any move for the promotion of the St John Valley Railway, Mr Hazen publishes a letter of MacKenzie and Mann's over a year old showing that these railway builders at that time demanded from the province a bond guarantee of \$30,000 per mile for a road from Westfield to Centerville, pointing out that they could reach St John from Westfield over the C P R tracks and declining to give a positive guarantee to connect this line with the transcontinental, though stating that "the necessities of the case would soon compel it, and there is no doubt in our minds that when seeking a winter harbor for the Canadian Northern this route would be adopted."

Mr Hazen doubtless desires to make the point that the company wanted too much for too little—that their demands were exorbitant. Possible this is correct. If not, then MacKenzie and Mann have lost their cunning. They are not in the railway business wholly for patriotic purposes and have the reputation of driving hard bargains when they can. But the point for the people of the St John Valley to keep in mind is that Mr Hazen never carried these negotiations a step farther, never made the slightest move to see if this or any other company would undertake this important work upon more reasonable terms. He not only let the matter stand where it was when Dr Pugsley was forced to drop it, but he even allowed the provincial subsidies, already granted for the purpose, to elapse, thus rendering impossible for the time any further action. And this at the very time when Dr Pugsley was using his effort and influence successfully to secure the federal subsidies required. The people whose hopes have been built on this road might have forgotten Mr Hazen's failure to bring nearer their desires if he had made any effort in their behalf. But he has not.—St John Sun.

And what makes the matter worse is the fact that B. Frank Smith, J. Kidd Fleming and Donald Munro sat in the House as dumb as the proverbial oyster, and allowed their leader to let the subsidies lapse. What do the people think of such careless representatives? What kind of a member would B. Frank Smith be at Ottawa? Even when he might have his faculties under control what good would he be, judged by his record?

Dr. Pugsley and the Province.

Dr. Pugsley's answer to his vindictive traducers is emphatic and explicit. As he puts it, it is only with a "little" that they accuse him of a "big" in the public treasury during his term of office as Attorney General. "A little" is "extras." This sum includes everything paid him during his long term of public service, salary, seasonal indemnity, travelling expenses, expenses of collecting, etc. The portion of this which Dr Pugsley received for legal services, outside his duties as Attorney General—the only accounts which can be questioned, as the rest is statutory and inevitable—is comparatively small, and his Minister has repeatedly offered to submit to impartial arbitration—an offer which Mr Hazen's government has repeatedly refused to accept.

Even those who are politically opposed to Dr Pugsley and who have been trained by his enemies to distrust him must admit that his attitude in this matter is the attitude of a man who desires nothing more than justice. Every dollar he has received from this province stands on the books in black and white. His claim against the province for more still due has been submitted, and has been published, in minute detail. Mr Hazen and his colleagues allege that the sums received and the sums claimed are exorbitant to the point of fraud. Dr Pugsley asserts that the whole is fair and just, and, in proof, at least of his personal belief in his assertion, offers to submit it in detail to one or more impartial arbitrators to be mutually selected by him and the government. If the government are convinced of the justice of their position and of the impropriety of Dr Pugsley's collections and claims, one is at a loss to understand why they so doggedly refuse to seek the opinion of men professionally qualified to judge and unprejudiced by personal or political animosity.

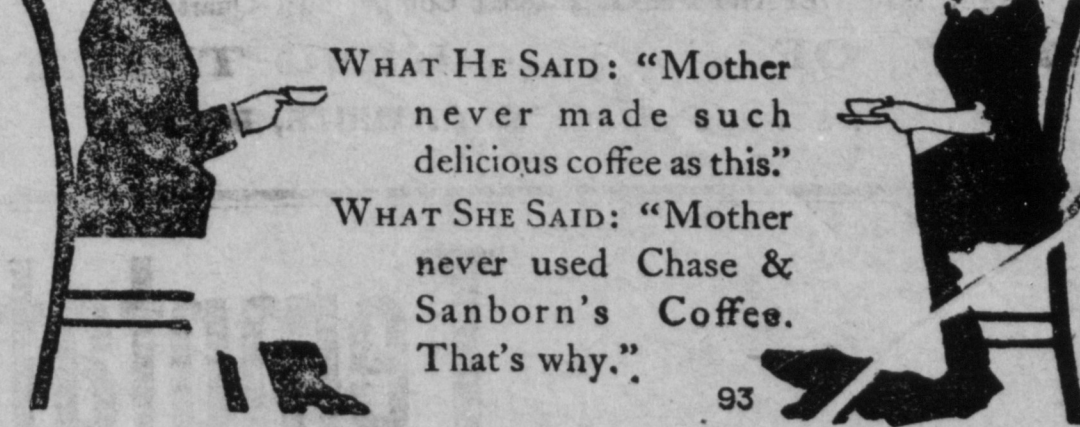
