

We understand the proposed structure is to be of brick, thoroughly modern, and large enough to accommodate eight departments. The heating is to be by steam. No doubt the whole town, and particularly Wellington Ward, will be proud of the building, which is to be ready for use a year from now. The cost is estimated at something like \$20,-000. Mr Mott has undertaken to have his plans ready in a week. About a fortnight will be given for tenders, and it is hoped that the successful contractor may be at work by the last week in August. 
