American Consulate General Monterey, Mexico, April 6th 1908.

To the President of the Board of Trade,
Woodstock, New Brunswick.

SIR,—I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 17th ultimo in which you state that the closing of the American Consulate in your city will inconvenience local shippers. You ask for information as to what steps can be taken to induce the American Government to maintain its Consulate at Woodstock. In reply I regret to state that apparently nothing can now be done, for Congress has already passed upon the matter. Shippers will not, in my opinion, be seriously inconvenienced. Under a decision rendered several years ago, it will not be necessary for them to go in person to a Consular office in another town to make the declarations to their invoices. This can be done by mall. For this reason, many offices, which were established at a time when shippers were required to appear in person at a Consulate for the purpose of there signing their Invoice declarations, are now being closed.

I have, however, referred your letter to the Department of State for its information.
