The Local Seat.

It now seems probable that Mr
Smith will go to the polls, conse-
quently it will be necessary for him
to resign his seat in the Assembly.
This will render a by-election neces-
sary, and no doubt we may expect
it some time early in the new year.
On the conservative side there have
been a lot of aspiring politicians, all
of whom seem to think they should
receive the nomination. It is scarce-
ly probable that Mr Smith will try
to get back in the Legislature, for
no doubt he will be glad to get out
of active participation in politics.
This will leave the way open for a
new man. Judging by past perform-
ances Mr Simms should get the
chance, but it is well understood that
the party managers have utterly no
use for him. John McIntosh is the
man who seems to have the inside
track, although Dr Peppers is feel-
ing very sure that he is the right
man for Fredericton. Then Fred
Squires is looking for high honors,
and so is Marv Hayward, but they
will probably be taken care of in
some other way. Coun Owens of
Wicklow and Coun Williams of Wil-
mot are likewise casting anxious
eyes in the direction of Fredericton.
