JUST A MIDDLEMAN.

The Press is prating every issue about the alleged wonderful things B Frank Smith has done for the Carleton County farmers. Can the Press or anyone else point to a single tangible benefit Mr Smith has ever given? True he has bought a lot of produce, but whose money did it? Certainly not B Frank Smith's. Any other ordinary man could have done quite as well for the people in the capacity of middleman, which Mr Smith has been occupying all these past ten or a dozen years. He is not a producer at all, he is simply one of the class living off the farmers' toil, technically known as middlemen. Smith's enduring monument will be The Double Barrel \$2 Road Law, by which the poll tax on every ratepayer in the county is to be doubled, and the rate per hundred increased 66 2/3 per cent. That's what he has given the farmers.

Brighton in Good Shape.

Hartland, N.B., Oct 12—Everything in this and adjacent parishes points victory to Liberal in the campaign. One well known Conservative was heard to remark to another that Smith will not have more than half the support in the village that he had last winter. It is very well known here, as it is elsewhere, that many Liberals voted last March for the present Conservative candidate with no thought of ever supporting him in an issue like the present.

Carleton County farmers are deaf to the appeal to denounce the government on the plea of increased taxation. They have thrived well under Liberal rule, many have become rich in the twelve years, and the only undue burden of taxation they know is the increased road tax. They realize that they buy more because they can afford to buy more.

They know that some of the goods they buy are imported, and in this way they pay an indirect tax through the customs. But the farmers are a bright class and know well that it is easier to buy imported goods today than it was twelve years ago, and, moreover, they buy imported luxuries today that under Tory rule they were compelled by hard times to do without. Not, however, that imported luxuries are so much cheaper by reason of rearrangement of tariff, but because the general betterment of their condition enables them to buy.

Carleton County farmers appreciate the good times and the great hue and cry made by the spell-binders does not impress them with a sense of being overburdened with taxation—excepting in the case of the road tax.

Death of Geo. William Squires.

On the 27th of last May, George William Squires died at Hornbeak, Tennessee.

He was born January 21st, 1849, in Kent, Co Carleton, New Brunswick, the son of Ptolemy Thomas and Orrinda Squires. His aged mother, now a resident of Long Beach, California, the daughter, of Edward Kearney of the locality before mentioned, now eighty-two years of age, along with five sisters survive him. Little George when but twelve years of age lost his father and his widowed mother imagining that the States offered better opportunities for her seven orphan children, soon after the death of her husband moved with them to Maine.

When nineteen years of age Geo. accepted a position with his uncle Frank Kearney, who owned and operated a lumber mill in Grand Rapids, Michigan. Here he married Miss Levina Himes, moving with his wife to Bryan, Ohio, where he purchased a saw-mill and commenced business for himself. His venture proved a success. It was while he was in Bryan that he invented a fly-wheel, said by experts to have been a fine stroke of genius. Owing to the scarcity of lumber in Ohio, he determined to go back to Tennessee. Here he found a rich field in lumber, and during his one years stay there amassed a handsome fortune. But, alas! his material success was dearly earned, for no doubt the malarious climate of that section caused his death, all along through he wanderings of the little orphan boy to manhood and up to the day of his death he was never accused of a dishonorable act. His integrity his reverence for truthfulness in its very phrase, his clean and strong character commanded the respect of all who knew him; and when he died, high and low alike attended his funeral, laying wreaths upon the grave of the man whom they had learned to love and esteem.
