

The Highest Building in the World.

TO HAVE 25 FEET ADDED TO IT-675 FEET ABOVE THE SIDEWALK.

A revision of the plans of the uncompleted cloud-piercing tower of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company's building on Madison Square shows that the steel supports can bear more weight and the Architects have practically decided to add 25 feet to the tower previously planned to reach 658 feet above the sidewalk.

There will be a lookout at a point about 675 feet above the curbing, according to the revised plans. At 683 feet the Metropolitan tower will be the tallest inclosed building in the world, or about 70 feet higher than the Singer building tower, which now holds the record. When completed, there will be but one structure in the world rising to a greater height than the Metropolitan tower-the Eiffel tower in Paris.



SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Saskatchewan and Alberta, except ting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-
