Liberalism and Temperance.

The Liberal party has always been fair in its attitude towards the legislative demands of the temperance people of Canada. Every advance along the lines of restrictive legislation, whether in the federal or provincial arenas, has been made by that party. Of a necessity, such reforms move slowly; and those leaders, who represent the people as a whole and who by virtue of that position are prevented from legislating in advance of average public sentiment, cannot at any time put upon the statute book laws to suit the sentiments of the most advanced of the reformers. Hence all governments and all parties have to constantly endure the harsh criticism of these, for not being more radical in their handling of the question. Extremists are thus ever and always against the powers that be, because of their alleged delay and inadequacy. Thus while falling short of satisfying the class of temperance people, the Liberal party in Canada has always acted with much greater fairness in dealing with the temperance question than have their opponents. Practically every valuable piece of temperance legislation passed in Canada, both before and since confederation, has been the work of the Liberals; the Dunkin Act, Local Option, the P.E. Island Prohibitory Law and the Scott Act, a much abused though excellent statutory enactment. Our late provincial government always gave a patient hearing and careful consideration to the just demands of the temperance people and was usually found ready to enact, amend or strengthen any laws for the advancement of moral reform. One of the conditions which came in for strenuous condemnation on the part of those interested in the enforcement of the Scott Act was the C.O.D. shipment of intoxicating liquors into Scott Act counties from the licensed dealers in the large towns. The matter was brought before the local government two years ago and given an attentive and sympathetic hearing, followed by legislation as desired, and now comes the news that the Liberal government at Ottawa has also passed the required amendment in a most stringent form. Hereafter, all liquors brought into any of the Scott Act counties of New Brunswick from outside will be subject to seizure and confiscation, and all persons or companies carrying it will be subject to heavy fines. The law, of course, does not prevent the importation of liquors for medicinal, scientific and sacramental purposes. Our Tory

friends talk loud and fast about temperance legislation as long as they are in Opposition, but the temperance reform of the Dominion of Canada from a statutory standpoint practically owes nothing to the various Tory Government that have reigned at Ottawa or in the Provinces. The Liberals alone are the hope of the reformers in temperance as in all other reforms. So easy of proof is this, that we feel confident in saying that, generally speaking, a vote given for the Tory party in this Province, is a vote given against temperance legislative reform.

A Bad Memory.

The clever young gentleman who contributed the able editorial in Monday's issue of our contemporary assures his readers there are certain political transactions which will not be forgotten. Just to make sure that some others, not as yet mentioned by him and not likely to be, will be kept in the foreground we will give them prominence.

During the past ten years the progress made by Canada along all lines has been more than remarkable. For the ten years prior to the Liberal government coming into power, stagnation, depression and discouragement reigned supreme. A few facts and figures will prove this statement beyond a peradventure. The revenue of Canada in 1896 was only thirty three million dollars. Ten years later, in 1906, the revenue was thirty six millions an increase of three millions in ten years. This was under Conservative rule. Hon. Mr. Fielding started his financial housekeeping in 1897 with a revenue of \$37,829,778. In 1906 it had grown to over \$80,000,000 an increase of \$42,000,000 in ten years against three million under Conservative rule. This tremendous increase was brought about not by an increase but by a reduction in taxation.

The public debt during the last eleven years under Conservative rule increased \$62,000,000. During the Liberal rule the public debt has only increased \$5,000,000. What do the electors think of the contrast? The total trade of Canada during the last eleven years of Conservative rule totalled \$219,000,000. In the eleven years of Liberal rule the total trade of the country aggregated over \$617,000,000 an increase of \$400,000,000 in eleven years.

What do the electors think of the contrast. Do they want Foster or Fielding at the financial helm of the country?
