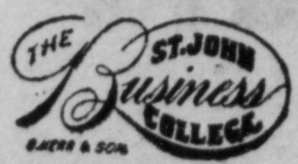

CARVELL AND BORDEN SPEAK AT FREDERICK TON JUNCTION.

Col. McLean's Labor Day picnic at the Junction was a great success. SIR FREDERICK BORDEN.

Sir Frederick Borden was in fine form and was accorded a very hearty reception. After paying a tribute to Colonel McLean and expressing the belief that he would make an energetic representative, Sir Frederick remarked in this appropriateness of holding a Liberal picnic on Labor day. The Liberal government had promoted labor legislation and in this connection he called attention to the conciliation act, and the establishment of the labor bureau. The policy of the Tory party and of Foster in particular was one of slander and they had not been able to establish any charge of malfeasance against the government. Foster takes credit to himself for his great economy when finance minister, but the records show that he starved the public services. In 1895 he refused to give the militia their annual drill and to expend money in necessary public works, but in this same year he had a \$6,000,000 deficit. The great development of trade, the volume having been trebled in the past three years, was an evidence of the success of the Liberal government. The taxes are less per capita than in 1896 and the British preference had not only reduced the rate on British goods one-third, but had knit Canada closer to the Empire.

Speaking of his own department, Sir Frederick defended the increase in expenditure, pointing out that nearly \$2,000,000 had been added as a result of Canada garrisoning Halifax and Esquimaux, thus relieving the British taxpayers of that amount. Foster pretended imperialism, but it was unblushing cant and hypocrisy. Foster wants higher morals in elections, and he preached that doctrine in Colchester last November, and the choice tomatoes campaign followed in that constituency.

Sir Frederick defended the Ross rifle at length, pointing out that at Bisley this year the best records in the world were made by marksmen using that arm. After scathing reference to Foster's record with respect to the Foresters' fund, the part he played in the dishonest methods employed in cheating G. G. King out of his seat in Queens and his betrayal of Sir MacKenzie Bowell, Sir Frederick closed with a strong appeal on behalf of Colonel McLean's candidature.

F. B. CARVELL, M. P.

F. B. Carvell, M. P., in a vigorous address which was heartily cheered, discussed the various scandals charged against the government and showed how miserably the Tory party had failed to make good their insinuations. Laurier promised Canada peace and prosperity, and he had kept his word. He settled the Manitoba school question, which threatened a racial and creed war, and he had given twelve years of unequalled prosperity.

Mr. Carvell showed how the government had peopled the West, bringing in as many as 25,000 yearly, while the Tories neglected their duty in this respect. He then proceeded to strip bare Foster's monkeying with the Foresters' funds, how he and his associates pocketed \$300,000 in profits, and his observations on this subject aroused the audience to a great pitch of enthusiasm. Do you want this man to handle the revenues of Canada? You have the Tory government in this province for six months and what have you got? A voice—"A doubled road tax." Do you want the Tory party in power at Ottawa? "No, no," was the vigorous answer that came from the audience. Mr. Carvell's address was one of the finest campaign speeches heard in this province for many a day, and on closing he was given an ovation. Cheers for the King, Laurier and the speakers closed the most successful campaign meeting ever held in Sunbury.—St. John Sun.

The new nominee of the Liberal Party in Charlotte County, N. B., Mr. William F. Todd, was born in 1856. He ran for the Provincial Legislature in 1899, and led the poll, receiving 2,571 votes against 2,157 for Mr. Gummer, who led on the opposing side. Hon. Mr. Emmerson was then the Provincial Premier. Mr. Todd sat out the term of the Legislature for which he was elected, but would not offer again.

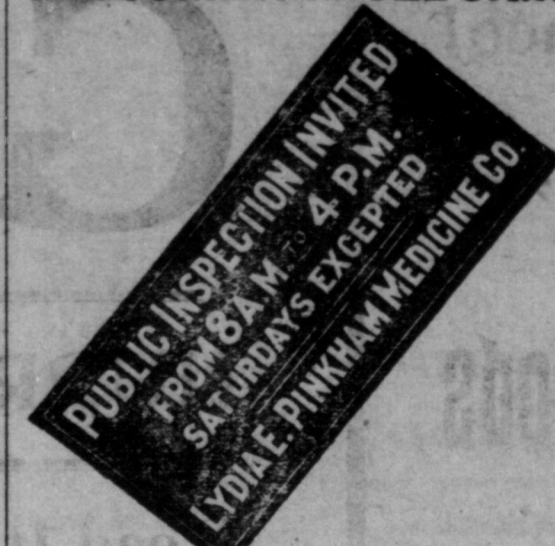

All indications point in the direction of a great Liberal victory in the above constituency. Colonel McLean is meeting with the greatest encouragement in his tour of the two counties. The Tories have a slim nomination R. D. Wilnot, who four years ago had only 114 majority. SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situated. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

DUTIES.—(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intent.
