Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excep ting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 Application for entry must be

made in person by the application at a Dominion Lands Agency or Subhowever, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader. The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under

each year for three years. (2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required resi dence duties by living on farming mas trade a beautiful line of land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent in the vicinity of his homestead.
