It is remarkable at least that in what we mortals call an accident, although there is no such thing in the workings of Providence as an accident—may turn the current of a man's life; may change his career altogether. Not many years ago, a young man was employed as a sawyer in the large lumber mill of J. R. Booth, Ottawa. One day he met with an accident in which he lost his left arm. It was then that he resolved to study law. By application and tireless energy he forced ahead, until he became one of the leading members of the bar in Eastern Ontario. He had no advantages, no influential friends, no pull of any kind in his uphill struggle. By his own unaided efforts and strength of mind and character he came to the front. When the Hon. R. W. Scott, Secretary of State, in the Federal Government, stepped out of his office at the advanced age of eight-four years, Sir Wilfrid Laurier chose Hon. Charles Murphy as his successor, the same young man who met with the accident in the saw mill. The new Secretary of State is as well versed in law, system of government and parliamentary procedure as if he had spent several terms in the House. He has always held aloft a high standard of citizenship, morality and honor. He held strong views and was never afraid to take a firm grasp for what he conceived to be right. He is a fluent forceful speaker, a ready and clever debater, and will add strength to parliamentary oratorical ranks. His elevation to the Cabinet furnishes another of those decidedly rare instances where the office itself has sought the occupant, rather than the occupant the office.

Many years ago, in a certain locality in Pictou County, a young man was working a hay-cut at least, that is the way I was told—and somehow or another, he got his left arm entangled in it so that before he got it out, he was minus his fingers. This accident changed the current of his life. He looked upon it as a call from God to devote himself to His service. He regarded it as a call to higher and more exalted duties. He at once put his hand to the plough and never looked back. He distinguished himself as a scholar, then as a pastor, then as one of the leading divines of his church as a platform speaker, as a charming writer, as a prominent leader in political, social and moral reforms as an educationist, as a traveller who took notes as he went along, and finally as Principal of one of Canada's leading Universities. He led a busy useful life. He left few like him, for he was a man above his fellows. When he died, thousands mourned because a cedar had fallen. And Canada was the poorer when Principal George M. Grant passed away.—Free Lance.
