This has been a young men's campaign. Never before has the rising generation entered so enthusiastically into the fight. Early in the struggle the younger voters of both parties organized into clubs and settled down to hard work. They have conducted meetings, assisted in organization and are to day strongly represented at every polling booth in the town and many in the county. Numbers of them who have never before appeared on the platform have ably entered into discussions of the issues of the day and numbers of them show signs of becoming able and eloquent speakers. As a rule the young men are inclined to develop in the fight stronger personal feelings, which are not found in the cases of older campaigners, this being due to inexperience, for they have scarcely learned to regard an election as a side show to the main performance of life.

NEW YORK, Oct. 28.—With the election day little more than a week away the leaders of all the political parties today started out on the final effort of what is expected to be a sensational finish of the national political campaign. New York is the real battle ground in the opinion of the campaign managers and there today were gathered practically all the heavy ammunition of all the parties. Wm H Taft and Wm J Bryan, who came in from stamping tours yesterday spent the night in this city. Both were astray today to begin a week of work which will tax their endurance to the utmost. Bryan's schedule today provides several speeches in half a dozen towns, and a long formal address at the big mass meeting in Madison Square Gardens this evening. Mr Taft had a midday engagement in New Haven, but he will return to New York this afternoon and deliver a number of addresses before midnight. He will devote the entire week to New York State. In addition to Mr Taft and Mr Bryan, hundreds of speakers will appeal to voters of all classes throughout the state today and for the remainder of the week. They will include party candidates for Governor, members of President Roosevelt's cabinet, U S Senators, members of Congress, and just plain political agitators. Vice Presidential candidate Sherman also is scheduled for a number of speeches in New York state during the week.

In other states the greatest activity will be shown in Ohio and Indiana. Vice President Fairbanks and John W Kern, the Democratic candidate for the Vice Presidency, living in those States.

The campaign has been an exceptional one in many respects. It has been conducted by the Opposition party in a thoroughly discreditable

manner; it has been marked by slander and scandal, by misrepresentation and maliciously untrue charges against the Liberal Government as a whole, and in many cases against individual members. Until some three weeks ago there was but little interest taken in the fight as no great issue has been before the people, but since the first of October the slander campaign has been so fiercely conducted that electors on both sides have been thoroughly aroused and have taken up the struggle not only with energy but in many cases with bitterness. In politics a very remarkable condition is always found. Men who are ready to fly at each others' throats during the month preceding the balloting, and who would almost fight on the streets on election day, walk around town, arm in arm, the very best of friends five minutes after the polls are closed, and condole with each other on the result. It will be the same in this campaign with a few exceptions. The strain on friendship has been very strong: there have been bitter personalities used in some cases and feelings have been roused which even the passing of the election may not wholly obliterate. It is unfortunate that this has been the case, but it will be best for everyone to forget, as well as he is able, all that has been said. After all, politics is not the principal thing in life; it is only a game and relaxation from the mere routine duties, and in many instances it looked upon, even by the most active workers, as a fad or an amusement, although the more serious side is not forgotten.—Star.
