#### The Spoils System.

An article under the above caption appearing in the editorial column of the issue of the Dispatch for March 11th, seems to call for brief passing notice. In the first place, after anticipating a wholesale slaughter of officeholders, the learned writer, evidently in sympathy with the administration that is to be, plays the part of the candid friend, and offers a little salutary advice in the direction of staying the hand of the executioner. This is all very well, save that it seems merely the act of blowing cold to balance that of blowing hot in the last paragraph, which reads as follows:—"But all the officeholders in this portion of New Brunswick unhappily for themselves do not enjoy a reputation for being above political suspicion. . . . If there is the usual slaughter among an incompetent and partisan officialdom, there will be no great surprise and perhaps less sympathy." Mark the words "above political suspicion"! It is under this new code of political ethics that any officeholder suspected, of being a Grit must walk the plank? As to incompetent officeholders, we know of very few in Carleton County—most of them named before the political turnover in 1898. If the partisan Grit be displaced on account of his politics the great wrong will probably be righted by the appointment of a partisan Tory! This "incompetent and partisan officialdom" seems to be on a par with "a corrupt democratic government."

There is no justification for the statement that "If a clean sweep of every petty office holder is made it will only be a repetition of the past." Does the writer fully measure the effect of his words? Is he aware that in 1883 when the Blair government came into power scarcely a single officeholder was disturbed? Does his memory go back that far, or is he speaking from hearsay? The records certainly fail to bear him out. A fish is not at home out of water.

**LIBERAL CONVENTION.**  
Supporters of Laurier in New Brunswick Meet at St John April 21.

Ottawa, March 12th.—As the result of a conference held this week between the Ministers and members of parliament for New Brunswick, together with Premier Robinson and Hon Mr McKeown, it was decided to call a convention of the Liberals of the province to meet in St John on Easter Tuesday, April 21st.

This will be the first general gathering of New Brunswick Liberals since the appointment of Hon Dr Pugsley as Minister of Public Works. The main purpose is to enable the new minister to discuss with his leading supporters all matters of interest to the party and to ascertain their views. It is likely also that some measures will be taken for organization throughout the province.

The formal call for the convention will be issued at once by A. O Skinner, president of the New Brunswick Liberal Association.
