## The County Court.

The court met on Monday morning and was busy all day with the case of J T Allan Dibble vs Frank R Shaw, an action on a note for \$130. This note was in favor of The Woodstock Carriage Company, signed by Daniel A Grant, and endorsed by defendant Shaw. Grant gave the note to plaintiff as settlement for goods, A B Connell K O for plaintiff; Hon W P Jones K O for defendant.

The first witness was the plaintiff, who deposed that Grant gave him the note in settlement for goods. He believed the endorsement to be in Shaw's handwriting. On cross-examination he said he did not recollect the exact consideration for which the note was given.

J Norman W Winslow, called by Mr Connell, produced a couple of documents bearing signature of defendant, one of which had been acknowledged. He gave it as his opinion that the endorsement on the note in question was that of defendant.

Wm M McQuinn, Manager Bank of Nova Scotia, gave evidence of an expert nature. He had had twenty years experience, and from comparing Shaw's signature on back of the note with what he knew to be genuine, expressed his belief that the endorsement was Shaw's.

Jan H Harvey, proprietor of the Aberdeen Hotel, was called for the purpose of producing the hotel register, on which were several entries of defendant's name. Mr Harvey said he supposed they were written by defendant but he did not ordinarily tax his memory with particulars of such nature.

For the defence Hon Mr Jones put Mr Shaw on the stand. He positively denied endorsing the note, and on cross-examination could not be shaken.

After the charges by counsel and judge the jurors retired. When two hours had gone by they returned a verdict for defendant. Mr Connell asked that the jury be polled. They stood 4 to 1. The members were Major W C Good, Chas F Rogers, Ambers Giberson, W A Estey and Arthur Baird.

The remaining cases, it is understood, were compromised.
