SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, except ting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the application at a Dominion Lands Agency or Subagency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy may however, be made at an Agency on over 2500 others.
