Avondale is on the Little Presque Isle river 3 miles below Lakeville. It has a grist mill, saw mill butter box factory and wood work-R E Streeter, of Providence, R I, ing factory all run by water power and it is an established fact that the Little Presque Isle is the bes ing Williamstown Lake six miles long by three miles wide and the Avondale dead water 31 miles long and half a mile wide; also the Morgan Lake emptying into the Avondale dead water through the Perdean stream. The woodworking factory is lighted by electric light provided by a motor in the building.

The saw and grist mills were built by Clark & McCready in the sixties and have been in continuous use ever since. The box factory was opened by G F Burpee, who is also owner of the saw mill at present. The box factory has been operating since 1900.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, except ting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is

the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres more or less. Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Inderwear

agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy mays however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader. DUTIES .- (1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirment.

(3) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while live owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intend


