### Avondale.

Avondale is on the Little Presque Isle river 3 miles below Lakeville. It has a grist mill, saw mill, butter box factory and wood working factory all run by water power and it is an established fact that the Little Presque Isle is the best mill stream in Carleton Co. having Williamstown Lake six miles long by three miles wide and the Avondale dead water 3 1/2 miles long and half a mile wide; also the Morgan Lake emptying into the Avondale dead water through the Perdean stream. The wood-working factory is lighted by electric light provided by a motor in the building.

The saw and grist mills were built by Clark & McCready in the sixties and have been in continuous use ever since. The box factory was opened by G. F. Burpee, who is also owner of the saw mill at present. The box factory has been operating since 1900.

The writer was highly favored with the privilege of riding with Mr Gillman the government mail carrier, who is well prepared to do his Majesty's service with four horses by passing Jacksonville Corner down the third tier to Waterville and viewing the saw and grist mills owned by E. Mallory and the stores and post office owned by H. M. Dewitt & Son which is right in the lower flat of the Orange Hall, which is a splendid building and a credit to the Orangemen of Waterville. It also contains a school and two churches. The business and surroundings is evidence of prosperity. In passing down through the country I see that the potato diggers are busy and according to the average of potatoes, in the near future the outside wages will be higher and will save a lot of extra work. The space will not permit me to speak of each separately, but one I will mention in Avondale, L. A. W. Brown who is the owner of a farm containing 142 acres which is a first class and well cultivated farm. This summer it yielded 60 tons of hay, 700 bus of wheat, 1.5 buckwheat, and 587 bbls of potatoes from 4 acres of ground with only 1 1/2 tons of fertilizer.

Starting from Woodstock by way of Jacksonville and arriving at Avondale had the pleasure of spending the night at the residence of L. A. W. Brown and enjoyed a very pleasant evening with music and singing. Miss L. Brown presided at the organ while L. A. W. Brown, Misses Alma Brown and G. A. Evans accompanied her with singing, and I must say in conclusion that in all my travels through Car Co I have not (without exaggerating) say it is the best singing I have ever listened to. I was treated with great respect for a stranger, having breakfast in the morning I went on with my travels.

Bradford DeLong is Avondale's blacksmith.

S. G. Barter has a nice little store already for a tenant and anyone wishing a business in a prosperous country will do well to occupy the building at once.

Allan Barter dug and picked with the help of a man and 4 boys, 100 bbls of potatoes in one afternoon.

John DeWitt dug 480 bbls of potatoes from 4 acres of ground being an average of 120 bbls per acre.

I had dinner at S. G. Barter's at Avondale and sat from a revolving table invented and made by the Barter Bros when they were in business in their wood working business and the table worked like a charm, revolved easy as a bicycle wheel and twelve people could be helping themselves at once. It was an oval table.—Calvin Green.

### Letter to Returning Officer.

Oct 13th, 1908.

Dear Sir,—There is an opinion prevailing in the public mind in which I think you concur that the galleries in the Court House at Upper Woodstock are not safe to hold a large body of people, such as gathered there last Feb. to the nomination. As the indications now point to a similar gathering on the 19th to the Federal nominations I have thought it fit and proper to have the building looked over by a competent mechanic which I have done, and he reports to me that in his judgment it is positively unsafe in its present condition, and further adds that it is not near as safe as it was last Feb. for at that time everything was frozen which added to its strength at that time. He advises the locking of the gallery doors and not allow any person in the gallery. I had it looked over with a view of strengthening it in some way and I am advised that to make it absolutely safe would cost considerable and now too late, to have that done. We found the main sills were all air rotten, and Mr Post, the man who examined it, said he would not be surprised if the joists were in a like condition to a certain extent, and therefore I take this opportunity of notifying you of the conditions and would recommend that you give due notice, so that the electors may know and be properly warned of the danger. The nomination will be under your direction. I do not wish to be understood as shifting the responsibility upon your shoulders, but only anxious that every precaution should be taken against a disaster and that you use your official power to prevent same. I think after your court is closed the speeches should be delivered at some other place to be agreed upon by both parties. You will agree with me that it would be a sad thing if a lot of men should be killed and injured.
