
Consul-General Skinner at Marseilles has been making an exhaustive study of French methods, and his report has recently reached Washington. Some French farmers have their own small stills. Others employ an itinerant distiller who comes with his plant, much as the American thrashing machine owner takes his equipment from farm to farm. The best crops are never distilled with any profit, but poor or damaged crops, whether grapes, potatoes or grain, are regularly used, and so, also, is the residue left in the process of wine manufactured and other waste products of the farm. Beets can be grown and used directly for this purpose, except when the price of alcohol falls very low. A damaged crop, a poor grade, or a crop in time of such low prices that the cost of gathering is prohibitive, as is occasionally the case with our apple crops, could be used to advantage by the farmers of this county.






