Local Bye-Elections.

The strength of the Liberal position shown in the result of recent by-elections for several of the Provincial legislatures more and more evidences the helplessness of the Conservative party. In New Brunswick the by-elections on the first of this month in Carleton and Northumberland counties reversed the decision given by these two constituencies last March in favor of the Hazen Government. This stinging blow to Premier Hazen has all but precipitated a crisis in the Local Government, as one of the members of the Government is accused of not supporting the administration candidate in Northumberland. The fact is that the future will be the outcome of all this doubtless bring about a severance of coalitions in local politics in New Brunswick. This will mean the almost certain return to power of the Liberal party in that province.

The leader of the Local Opposition, ex-Premier Robinson, is a public man whose training and common-sense entitled him to popular confidence and his hold on the Province but awaits the opening of the constituencies to demonstrate it fully. It is not often that the chief of a Government so unconsciously rushes to such a hasty and overwhelming fall as has Premier Hazen in our sister province. His incompetence and over-weening self-appreciation have been the distinguishing characteristics of his accidental career.

In the west two by-elections last week in Saskatchewan saw the return of Messrs Calder and Motherwell both members of the Scott Government by large majorities, both the Opposition candidates indeed losing their deposits. These bye-elections were occasioned by the return to the Federal Parliament of the late sitting members of the Local.

Five by-elections for the Local House come off in Quebec during the Christmas week in some of which the Conservatives are not able even to run a candidate and as a consequence all will return supporters of the present Liberal Government in that province—North Sydney Herald.

The Protest "Limit."

The petition against the return of Sir Wilfrid Laurier for Ottawa City is the limit of Tory vindictiveness. In 1904, the effort was to annoy the Minister of Finance by petitioning his return in that year, which culminated in his triumphant return in the bye-election in Queens-Shelburne in 1906, demonstrated the altogether unequal position of Mr. Fielding before the whole country. The petition against the Prime Minister is to prevent the City of Ottawa from being represented in Parliament during the coming session. But it has a more sinister purpose—nothing less than to convey to Canadians generally the impression that the Liberal chieftain in some way obtained his election in an unlawful manner. The charge is made that the Premier influenced the vote by words in a letter to his colleague indicating the fact that his attention having been drawn to the request of the Civil Service for increased remuneration, Sir Wilfrid was prepared to give the request his personal consideration, but distinctly disclaiming any purpose on the Government's part to necessarily grant the request. Of course the same element of the Conservatives in Ottawa see the utter absurdity of the grounds upon which the protest is based but for the time it affords the baser sort the opportunity they wanted of attempting to black-mail the first citizen of Canada.

While Canadians of all parties justly realize and properly claim that men of extraordinary calibre have appeared in the public life of the Dominion, yet the universal acknowledgement is made that none have surpassed Sir Wilfrid Laurier as a ruler and a patriot. The general feeling throughout the British Empire is that it is fortunate for Canada that it has such a man to guide the destiny of our country at this time. His return to Parliament by the citizens of both the cities of Quebec and Ottawa was too much to escape the envious envy of the underground brigade of the Tory party.
