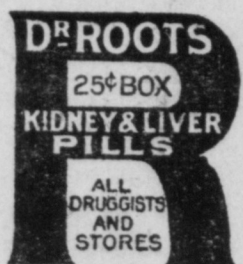

**Smallpox Stamped out**

EDMUNSTON N. B., Dec. 22 During the early part of the fall an epidemic of smallpox broke out at Edmundston N. B. and at one time somewhat alarmed the residents of the town as over one hundred cases were reported; energetic steps were at once taken by the Mayor and council and Dr. Laporte the Medical Health Officer, and it is to their credit that the town is reported to-day to be absolutely free of any contagious disease; the quarantine on the last house to be affected was raised some days ago and no new cases have since been reported. Although the disease did not appear to be of a malignant type and at no time during the epidemic were any deaths reported due to smallpox, the authorities recognized the great importance of taking every means to stamp out the epidemic and keep it under control as there is a large transient population in the town, and vicinity at the present time, it being one of the centres of construction of the National Transcontinental Railway; for a few weeks business was affected but it has now resumed active proportions.

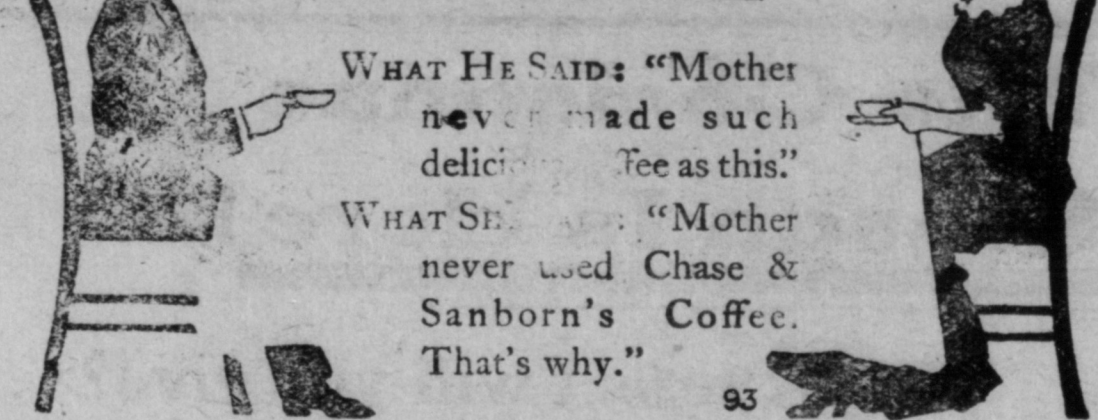
