House of Assembly.

Fredericton, N.B., May 7th.

Yesterday afternoon at the conclusion of Hon Mr Grimmer's remarks concerning the condition of his dept subsequently to the death of Mr W P Flewelling deputy surveyor or general, Hon Mr Hazen introduced the second reading of the Highway Act. The Act provides briefly as follows. That the Highway shall be placed as directly as possible under the control of the people. That parish represented by two Councillors with a chairman appointed by the government constitute local highway boards. That government pay their chairman out of provincial monies a sum not greater than that paid by the parish to the other members, that school districts constitute divisions for the supervision of the work with a commissioner in each division. That local boards make yearly estimates of the requirements of the parish for each ensuing year. These go to the Chief Commissioner, public works. The government then to make an appointment to each parish and the difference between the requisition and government grant to be made up by assessment. The County Council be authorized to lend money to boards until grants are received from the government and the assessment levied. That substitution of labor in place of money payment be at the discretion of each board, and if such labor be not performed before a fixed day, money payment shall be required. That commissioners submit returns of the monies expended by them each fortnight. That members of the board and commissioners shall have no money interest in any contract. That no length of occupation shall hereafter deprive the soil of its Highway character. That the rate of pay for breaking roads in winter be one half that allowed for statute labor. That there should be no disturbance of the soil within four feet of a road ditch. That local boards be allowed an expenditure of ten per cent of their funds to procure road machinery for their districts. That the accounts of the Highway boards be audited with the County accounts. Rates of taxation, poll tax and money value of days work to be settled in Committee.

Hon Mr Flemming introduced and briefly explained the new Audit Act. It provides for the constitution of a "Treasury Board" consisting of three members of the Executive Council of which the Provincial Secretary would be Chairman and the Clerk of the Executive Council act as Secretary. This board will have general power in all matters of revenue and expenditure and to make civil service regulation. Also power to adopt a plan of accountings for each

branch of the public service. The Auditor General will be removable from office only for cause upon an address concurred in by two thirds of the members of the Assembly. His Audit must be continuous and he will be responsible for every item of receipt and expenditure. He must countersign all cheques after having satisfied himself that the issue is authorized before they can be issued by the receiver general.

The Premier introduced an Act to amend the Workmens Compensation Act making better provisions for compensation to workmen when injured and extending the Act to include all classes of workmen.

The Premier also introduced an Act authorizing an enquiry into Central Railway matters. It provides for a commission of three persons, one of them a Judge of the Supreme Court or County Court or a barrister of not less than ten years standing.

They are to investigate the expenditure of all monies connected with the railway since Jan 1901 to trace the money received from the sale of bonds, all the facts and circumstance connected with the purchase of the Central Railway by the N B Coal and Railway Co, and all matters incident thereto and connected therewith with full power as Royal Commissioners to enforce the attendance of witnesses and compel the producing of books, documents, papers, etc. with power to punish persons guilty of contempt.
