## "LIVES OF GREAT MEN."

The Upper St John Valley Representatives in the Assembly.

Hon James Kidd Flemming, provincial secretary, is 40 years old, a native of the parish of Woodstock and a resident of Peel. He taught school for some years. Has been a general merchant at Canterbury, Woodstock and Peel, and a commercial traveller and life insurance agent, and is at present interested in the lumber business. An unsuccessful candidate for the legislature in Carleton in 1899, but was returned in the bye-election of 1900, and was re-elected in 1903 and 1908. Was financial critic for the opposition in the last legislature and was appointed to the office of provincial secretary on Mr Hazen's advent to power a few weeks ago. Married Miss Helena Flemming 1890. A Presbyterian and a Conservative.

Mr B Franklin Smith, a native of Jacksonville, a resident of Florenceville and 42 years old. Wholesale dealer in country produce. First elected to the legislature in 1903 and re-elected in 1908. Married March 20, 1888, to Miss Catherine May McLellan of St John. A Baptist and a Conservative.

Mr Donald Munro is a son of the late David Munro, who at one time represented Carleton in the Assembly and for many years afterwards was registrar of deeds for that county. He is about 50 years old, resides at Woodstock and is in the foundry business. He was superintendent of the Woodstock water works for some years and in 1906 and 1907 was mayor of that town. First elected to the legislature last March as a supporter of Mr Hazen. Married. Presbyterian and a Conservative.

Mr John Fletcher Tweeddale is a native of Fredericton, 52 years old and a resident of Arthurette. A farmer and trader. Was a member of the Victoria county council for eighteen consecutive years. An unsuccessful candidate for the legislature in 1892, 1895 and 1899. Elected in 1903 and re-elected in 1908, as a supporter of the present opposition. Married July, 1880, Miss Jean Campbell. An Episcopalian and a Liberal.

Mr James Burgess is a native of Grand Falls, where he resides, and is about 45 years old. He is extensively engaged in lumbering. Was first elected to the legislature in 1903 and re-elected in 1908. Married. Roman Catholic and a Liberal supporter of the opposition.

Col Jesse W Baker, a native and resident of Baker Brook, Madawaska county, and 53 years old. He occupied an active part in military affairs, volunteered for active service in the Northwest rebellion of 1885, and commanded a company of the provisional battalion, which started for the scene of the conflict, and is now Lt Col, commanding the 67th Carleton Light Infantry. First elected to the legislature last March as a supporter of the late government. Married Miss Bethsida Martin of St Hilaire, Madawaska. A Protestant and a Conservative.

Charles S Cyr is a native of Hamlin plantation, Maine, where he was born thirty years ago, but was naturalized a British subject Nov. 21, 1899. He resides at St Leonards, where he conducts a large farm and ferry service. First elected to the legislature last March. Married Miss Annie M Pelletier of Grand Falls. A Roman Catholic and a Liberal.
