As election day draws near, signs multiply pointing in the direction of a barefaced attempt to steal the election in this county by the managers of the conservative party, through the use of rum and money in a lavish degree. It behooves our friends to be constantly on the alert, and to see that the provisions of the law are rigidly enforced. The janus-faced policy of the conservative party is completely unmasked. Let there be no mistaking the fact that tory money will be poured out in Carleton. We have unmistakable evidence of the fact; the tory party have absolutely gone back on their professions of purity.—In fact they never intended to run a clean election. James Keenan of Johnville was in town this week visiting his son who is recovering from an operation for appendicitis at the Carleton County Hospital.

Monday night F B Carvell and George W Uphem addressed a fine meeting at Pembroke. Squire Butts very acceptably filled the Chair. Hon Mr Jones and Harry Carvell were at Lower Woodstock that evening, and they also had a big audience.

Mr Charles Churchill died at his home, Grand Falls, on Wednesday after several weeks sickness. The body was brought to the home of his son-in-law Frank Foster where the funeral will be conducted at 2 30 this (Friday) afternoon by the Rev Dr Kierstead. He leaves a wife and four daughters, Mrs Reid of Lawrence town Nova Scotia, Mrs F McKenzie of Centreville, Mrs Doherty of Massachusetts and Mrs Frank Foster of this town. Mr Churchill used to carry on the tin business in Woodstock.

Many of the older residents of Woodstock will regret to learn of the death of Mrs Margaret J Strickland, which took place last week in Truro. She was relict of the late George Strickland. Her son, C N S Strickland, is assistant general manager of the Union Bank of Halifax. The family left here in 1870.

Percy Gallagher, a Canadian Pacific Railway conductor from Woodstock, N B, prominent in the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen, was admitted to the New West minister Asylum for the insane on Tuesday. Friday afternoon he leaped from the deck of the steamer Unatilla into the sea, just opposite the heads at San Francisco while the vessel was bound for Seattle. He was picked up by a lifeboat. Gallagher was bound for Victoria. He had been visiting his wife at Los Angeles. It is said he was disappointed because Mrs Gallagher declined to return with him immediately. As the ship drew away from the heads Gallagher stole apart and with some rope yarn bound his hands together at the wrists. The shock as he struck the water brought reasons to the brain and he struggled to keep afloat until help reached him.

Aberdeen, Opposition in 1903 by a large majority, on Tuesday will greatly reduce the conservative lead. Kent which five years ago gave the government a very small vote, will easily roll up a hundred majority for Jones and his ticket. Wilnot, where B Frank Smith lavishly poured out \$10 bills for votes in 1903, will reverse its former verdict. Harry Carvell and his ticket will poll a very comfortable majority. Richmond will roll up at least 100 majority for Uphem, and his colleagues will be right at his heels. Wakefield should certainly give a Liberal majority of forty. Peel will go Opposition by a reduced majority, while Simonds will likewise show again for the government. Brighton is sure to give a small but comfortable government majority, the best the Opposition hope for being an even break. Northampton will at least give the Liberal ticket fifty majority; while the parish of Woodstock as usual will be pretty close. In the town of Woodstock Hon Mr Jones stands to lead the poll by a comfortable margin, carrying his colleagues with him, while on the other hand Mr Munro will scarcely poll so many as his running mates. It looks like a tremendous government victory.
