Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm at least 30 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$100 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$100 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

## Board of Trade Meeting.

A meeting of the Board of Trade was held on Monday evening, June 14th, at eight o'clock. Present—The President in the chair, Messrs His Worship, Mayor Jones, F B Carvell M P, J Fewer, I E Sheasgreen, G E Balmain, C M Augherton, Coun Dugan, Wm Balmain, H Burt, Frank Shea, Harry Noble, G Gibson, Rankin Brown, C L Smith, Sheriff Tompkins, C D Dickinson, J N W Winslow, Coun Hagerman and Wm Dickinson. Mr Dickinson was heard regarding the great amount of work which was carried on by the Tannery which was burned last week. He said the annual output was about \$300,000 a year. They paid out \$20,000 a year in wages, employing about 35 or 40 men, \$450.00 in taxes and water rates, and other expenses in the town about \$15,000. He would like to rebuild but it was a big undertaking and he wanted to hear what the Board would recommend to the Town Council to grant in the way of assistance.

After hearing Mr Garant of Quebec who was present and who has been interested in a like business for some years, the following resolution was moved by Mr Geo E Balmain, seconded by Mr F B Carvell and carried unanimously:—That the Board of Trade memorialize the Town Council to take a plebiscite of the ratepayers towards granting a bonus not exceeding 25 per cent of the valuation of the plant, to assist Mr Dickinson in re-establishing his industry.

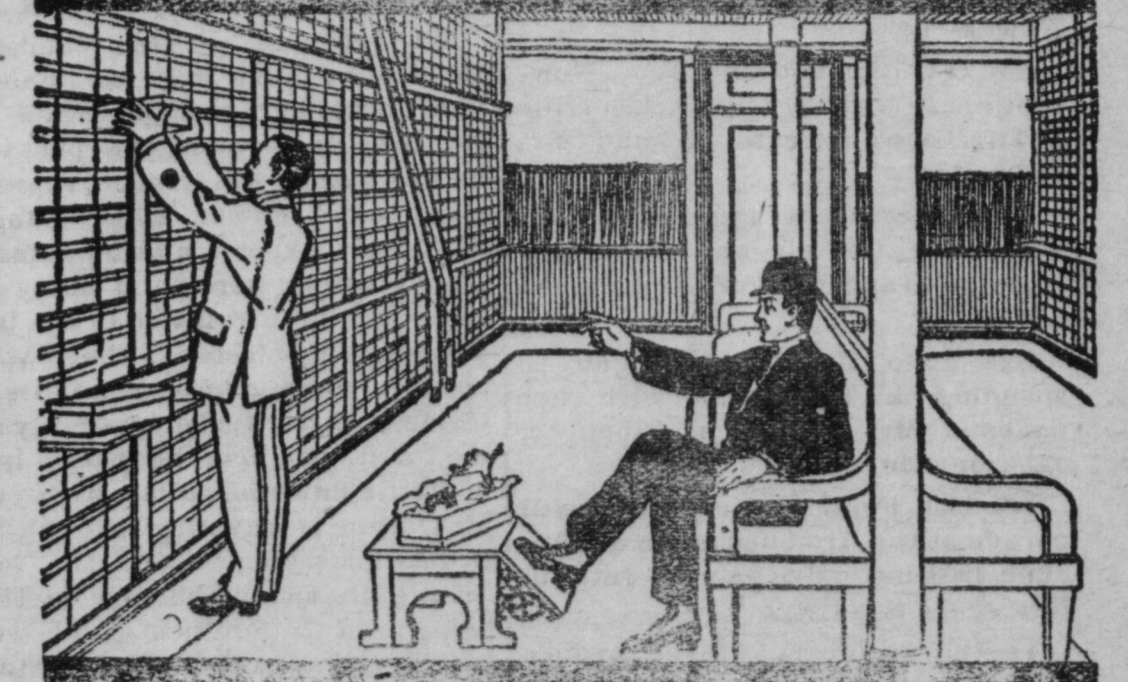
