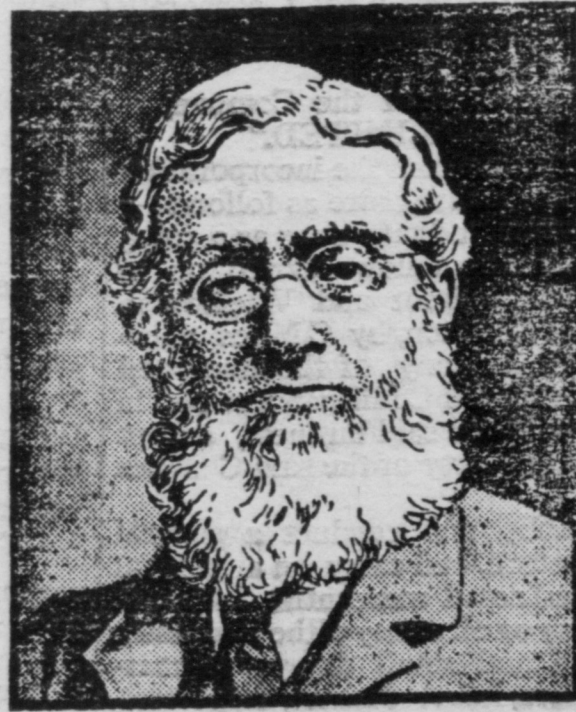

Some Flowers at a London
Exhibition.

Scientific horticulture has made a distinct advance says the London Mail, in its efforts to place the popular cactus dahlia above all question as a decorative garden flower. The progress which has been made in this respect was strikingly manifest at the National Dahlia Society's annual show which opened recently at the Crystal Palace.

From the time, thirty years ago, when the crimson Juarez, the parent of all the cactus dahlias, then newly imported from Mexico, was first distributed in this country, it has been argued against it, and also against many of the varieties developed from it, that they hide their flowers among the foliage. The National Dahlia Society has been doing its utmost to encourage cactus types which carry their flowers well above the leaves, and as a consequence three new dahlias were exhibited at this last show which drew general remark on their bold beauty of growth.

One was a large, rosy mauve flower appropriately named Erecta, its stem exceeded two feet in length, and at the lower part was of the substance of a light cane. The two others were Lightship, of clear yellowish white, and Revoluta, of dark crimson beauty, both having stems of very little flower growth than that of Erecta.
