### FEAR A TARIFF WAR WITH CANADA.

U.S. Officials Anxious to Prevent Friction, But do Not See How To Act.

Detroit, Oct. 22.—A Washington special tonight to the Free Press says: Probably never before have the officials of the United States Government read Canadian newspapers with the interest at present evidenced. For the papers of Canada, from Quebec to Vancouver, are engaged in stirring up a spirit of retaliation against the provisions of the Payne tariff and the Government is anxious.

When the Canadian parliament meets it is expected the public sentiment now being stirred up will centre at Ottawa. What form its expression will take is not known in Washington, but the officials here evidently expect the worst. At least, one may judge so, from the fact that the greatest possible care is being taken to make every feature of administration of the new law as free from friction as possible along the Canadian border. Public men here agree that it will be unfortunate for the United States if Canada starts a tariff war, and yet they also say it is difficult to see how Canada can very well do otherwise. Under the provisions of section 2 of the Payne law, duties on all goods imported from Canada must go up 25 per cent on April 1st, 1910, unless Canada place United States on the same footing with Great Britain as to trade in the Dominion. In case President Taft should be advised by his tariff commission that there has been no "undue discrimination" by Canada against this country, he may exempt Canada from this 25 per cent maximum. But in the face of the plain provision of the Payne law, there is grave doubt whether the commission could possibly so advise him.

Canada, as part of the British empire, favors Great Britain in its tariffs, and the Payne law seems to attempt to force Canada to refuse to continue this British preference, and is thus what public men here call an unwarranted interference with Canadian policy. The United States it is pointed out, claims the right to make such trade arrangements with Porto Rico, the Philippines, and the Canal Zone as it sees fit. When Canada claims a similar right as to Great Britain the new tariff law says its merchandise shall be subjected to the American maximum rates if offered for import into this country. This is the inconsistency in the Payne law which threatens the commercial peace of the country along the northern frontier. The trouble which may follow may easily prove very costly.

It is broadly intimated here that President Taft has been fully advised of the situation, and that if he cannot find any other way to avoid exciting Canadian retaliation, he will ask Congress to amend the Payne law.

Plaster Rock, N.B., Oct. 22.—(Special)—Elwood Giberson was arrested at his residence here about 9 o'clock this morning by G.T.P. Officers Pearson and Clout, on commitment papers issued by L.P. Farris, G.T.P. police commissioner. Giberson was handcuffed and placed aboard the train and taken to Perth and placed in jail.

About six months ago Giberson was summoned to appear in court to answer four different charges of selling liquor. He did not appear, but the cases were tried and proved and he was fined \$50 and costs or three months in jail for each offence. Commitment papers were issued, but the G.T.P. police have never been able to locate him until this morning.

The general Synod of the Church of England has been in session in St. John. The commission on Moral and Social Reform adopted resolutions calling on the government to so amend the criminal code as to include all professional betting whether on the race-track or not, to make adultery a crime, to provide special protection for Indian women and girls. New Gun To Shoot Airships Proves Success In Germany.

Paris, Oct. 25.—Experiments have recently been carried out in Westphalia, states the Matin, with a new Krupp gun, which has been designed for employment against airships.

The recent manoeuvres, both in France and Germany have demonstrated that ordinary field pieces are useless against the aerial enemy, which from a height of 2,000 feet is able to determine with exactitude the positions of a hostile force, whatever the inequalities of the ground may be. The two problems presenting themselves in connection with the construction of a gun for employment against airships are, first, the necessity for mobility, and second, the inclination of the gun towards any point in the horizon.

It is claimed that all obstacles have been overcome in the new Krupp model. Mounted on a motor car, it can give chase to an airship, while it can be fired in either a vertical or a horizontal position. It has a carrying power of five miles in a horizontal direction, and of three miles when aimed vertically.

The most curious feature, however, is the projectile, which, in addition to the shell, carries a fuse that leaves in the air a long trail of smoke, by means of which the trajectory can be observed and the angle of the sun rectified. The projectile is constructed to burst the moment it touches the balloon envelope.
