The announcement of the imposition of the retaliatory provisions in the Payne tariff against Canadian pulp and paper because Ontario and Quebec impose restrictions upon the export of pulpwood, will neither surprise nor frighten anybody. Free wood pulpcan no longer buy free pulp wood from Canada; and there are those who believe that free print paper should not be able to do

so. This piting up of duties on our pulp and paper is nothing more than the last desperate fling of a nation entirely conscious that its own supply of the raw material is running perilously low, and that it must soon import its pulp wood products in whatever form it can obtain them.

The policy of every Canadian pro rince should now be the entire prohibition of the export of pulpwood from all crown lands. It should be impossible for the American pulp mills to obtain a stick of pulpwood from Canada, expect the insignificant dribblets which may yet go over from privately owned copses. In this way we can keep our timber at home and attract hither the entire pulp-making industry of the continent. In time, the paper industry will follow it; for it always pays to manufacture as near to the sources things being equal. 
