Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family or a male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

Steel From Black Sand.

W J Shaw, a Toronto man, claims that he can produce fine tool steel from sand. The production is effected by means of a secret process of preparation of material, and of a specially devised patentable furnace. Shaw recently took a newspaperman through the entire operation, beginning with the separation of the magnetite from the silicate sand obtained on Hanlan's Island, showing the electro-magnetic separator, of his own invention, the furnace, the material as prepared and briquetted for the furnace, the first and most important product, steel bloom, and the forged steel; giving the productive capacity of the furnace, the cost of fuel and of material and labor; and sandwiching in reasons why, and technical information galore. It all seems to demonstrate conclusively that high grade tool steel ingots can be produced from this black sand, at about the market price of charcoal pig iron. Who can estimate the revolution which such a discovery is bound to make in the tool steel manufacturing interest in this country?

A Real Burglar Proof Safe.

A curious modern invention is to be seen by a favored few in the Bank of England. It is claimed to be an absolutely burglar proof safe, because at night it is lowered into a subvault of heavy masonry and concrete.

Elsewhere in this issue a Centreville correspondent brings to public notice that "an intimation equal to a promise" was made during the last Federal campaign which in effect was that, post, office buildings would be erected at Hartland and Centreville. The people well remember that Mr Carvell stated publicly, in this village, that a suitable building would be supplied within two or three years. On the occasion of his visit to Hartland on Monday the editor confronted Mr Carvell with the Centreville manuscript, and it is now a pleasure to quote the member as follows: "I am ready to back up with a promise what I gave as a matter of news to the people last autumn. Within the time I then specified there will be substantial structures furnished by the Dominion government for the accommodation of the post offices at Hartland and Centreville, as well as to accommodate any other government offices there may be in the communities."

The time Mr Carvell specified "was two or three years." Therefore we have his word that such buildings will be provided within one or two years from the coming autumn. Owing to a policy of retrenchment the government is endeavoring to carry out, there was not a penny voted for public buildings of any kind for any part of Canada during past session, and the estimates for last year have been withdrawn except for the buildings that were under contract prior to December 1st of last year.—Hartland Observer.

Attempted Suicide of Woodstock Man.

Joseph Oldham, of Woodstock, N. B., while insane attempted suicide Wednesday morning, June 16, at the home of his brother-in-law, A J Way, Lewiston, Me. Mr Oldham cut his throat with a razor with which he was shaving about 8.30 o'clock. Mr Oldham, who was on a visit, has shown signs of insanity for several days, relatives say. They wished him taken to Augusta Tuesday, so Dr W H Hawkins went with the man to the hospital. Mr Oldham could not be received, as no hearing had been held in Lewiston, according to the law's requirement. Dr Hawkins was obliged to take the man back to Lewiston, Me. Oldham was removed to the Central Maine General Hospital where it is said he will recover.
