### Not Partisan.

Toronto's shoulders are broad enough, says the News, to enable her to bear all the hard things said about her. As a matter simply of information it may be worth while to point out to those who live outside the borders that very often "Tory Toronto" does not mix up partisan politics with civic affairs. Mr. Urquhart is a Liberal, and during his second term as Mayor he ran in North Toronto for the Dominion House. This did not prevent him being given a third term. Last year, out of five members composing the full Board of Control, four were Liberals and one Conservative. This year the numbers stand: Three Liberals, two Conservatives. Mr. Oliver is a Liberal, yet he was re-elected Mayor on New Year's Day by probably the largest majority ever given to any man for a public office in Canada. Of the total twenty-three members of Council, including eighteen aldermen, four Controllers and the Mayor, thirteen are Liberals and ten Conservatives. All three aldermen from Ward Three, the wealthiest ward of the city, are Liberals.


### The Earthquake in Italy.

The reports of the earthquake in Italy indicate this latest seismic disturbance has proved one of the most destructive in recorded history. Calabria, the affected district, is situated at the toe of the Italian boot. It has repeatedly suffered from these visitations and there are reliable accounts of the engulfing of hundreds of people in fissures and crevasses opened up by subterranean movements in that locality within the last two hundred years.

The loss of life in the present calamity is placed at 60,000. This is truly appalling. Perhaps it is exaggerated, but we are told that an equal number went to death in the great earthquake at Lisbon in 1755.

Probably no part of the earth's crust can be regarded as absolutely free from these disturbances, but the scientists have mapped out what they call the earthquake zone, which extends around the world, embracing portions of the temperate and torrid regions. Jamaica and San Francisco in the north and Valparaiso in the south have recently paid toll to these natural convulsions.

There will be great distress in the stricken lands of Italy and Sicily. The Italian King has gone in person to the scene, and his government will doubtless adopt all proper measures for immediate relief. It goes without saying that they may count upon the assistance of the other nations if there is need for outside help.
