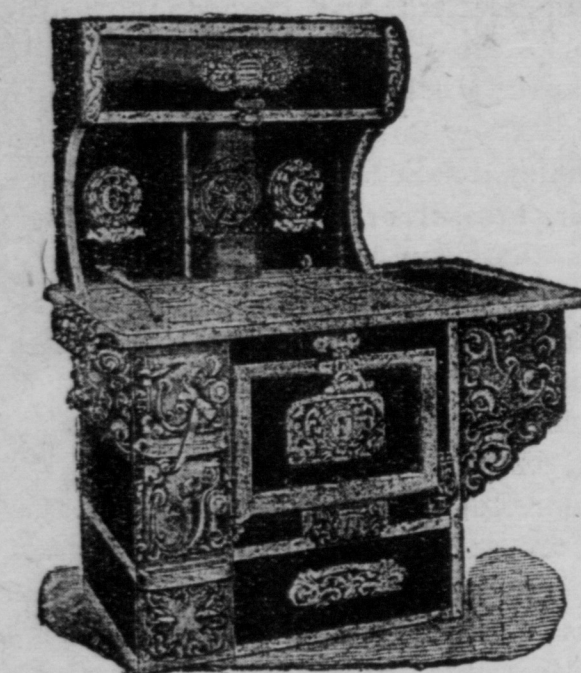

How To Make Cabbage Salad.

Airship Travel in Canada.

Dr G Sterling Ryerson, of Toronto, is authority for the statement that within ten years in Canada, it will be possible to travel by airship with comfort, speed and reasonable safety—arriving and leaving with much the same degree of certainty that is now assured by ocean-going steamers.

On the basis of 40 miles an hour, it would be possible to cross from Halifax to Liverpool (2,100 miles), in about 53 hours. A trans-Atlantic voyage, however, will not likely be undertaken in the very near future, according to Dr Ryerson, but it is not at all improbable that a line of airships will run from Halifax to Montreal, via St John, N B; from Montreal to Toronto, and from Toronto to Winnipeg and Vancouver.

At a speed of forty miles an hour, nine hours would be required for the run from Montreal to Toronto, but as the distance is calculated by railway mileage, it is probable that the time would be greatly reduced by a straight flight "as the crow flies." Dr Ryerson gives his reasons for this prediction in the December Busy Man's and also describes Count Zeppelin's achievements in Germany in most entertaining fashion.

New Steamship Service to N B.

Montreal, Dec 10.—St John may get a new steamship service direct with Australia, if the Elder-Dempster Company's plans materialize. They are now running six steamers between Canada and South Africa, and it is planned to put on eight additional steamers to run between St John and Sydney, Australia, making calls at South Africa. This would place 14 steamers in all in the new service. The company is submitting the matter to the Dominion government and seeks a subsidy.

### Experts At Work On Airship Gun.

Washington, Dec 4.—A gun is being designed by the ordnance experts in the United States army for the distinct purpose of shooting dirigible balloons and aeroplanes. General Crozier, Chief of Ordnance, in his annual report to the Secretary of War, submitted today outlines of some of the difficulties which this gun must overcome.

"Dirigible balloons and aeroplanes move rapidly, change direction quickly, alter their elevations at will and are removed from any objects that assist aiming," he says. For short ranges General Crozier says it is probable that small army rifles or machine guns against the man aboard airships will prove most effective. Sixty United States rifles, calibre 30 model of 1903, are now being fitted with a controller for vertical angle of fire.
