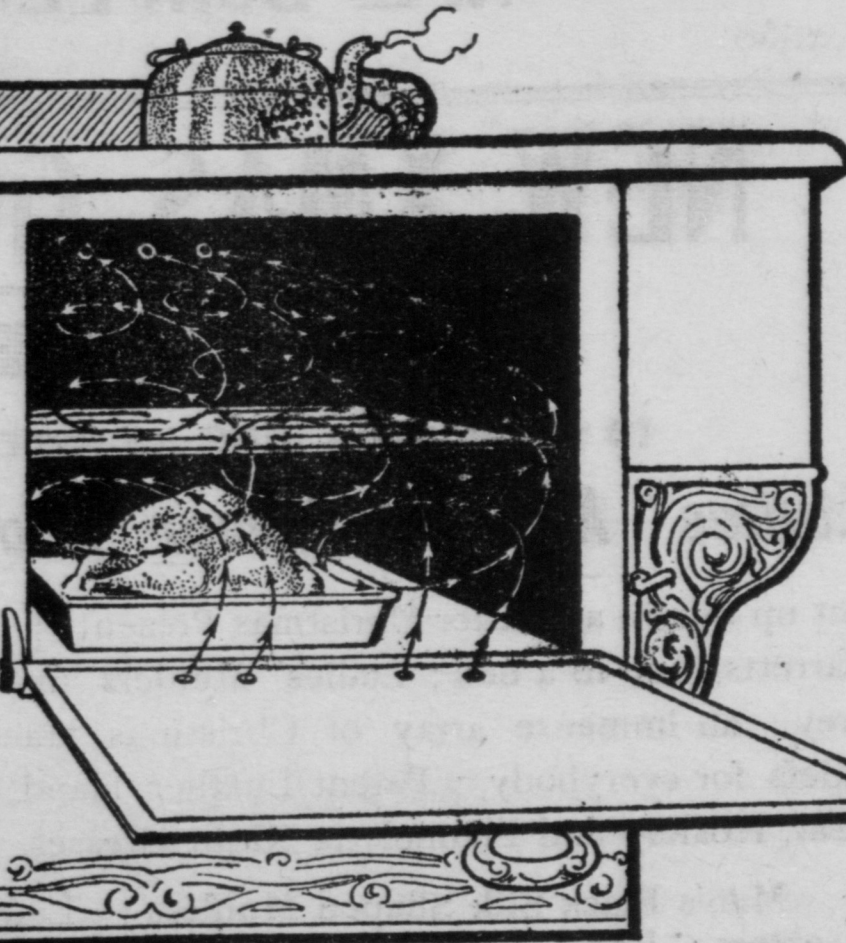


# Kootenay Steel Range

### Is Prohibition Right?

(Clean Politics)

This is the fundamental question. We should not ask first whether prohibition will pay better than license. Economics should yield that place to ethics. If prohibition of the liquor traffic is a wrong principle, it should never have a place in our government, even though it would increase our prosperity one hundredfold.

Not should the righteousness of the cause be made secondary to its practicability. We dare not say, "Prohibition is right enough, but it won't work." Duty is our results belonging to God.

The principal of prohibition is right. Most of the laws of the land are based upon that principle. We prohibit murder, burglary, arson and other evil things. Hence we recognize the righteousness of the principle.

But should the liquor traffic be placed in the same category as these things? Only upon one ground. If the traffic in intoxicants works evil to mankind, then it should be treated as other evils.

The contention of the prohibitionists is that liquor is doing more injury to society to-day than anything else. We say it is worse to make a man a drunkard than it is to steal his property, burn his house, or even murder him. That is a fearful indictment, but we are confident that we have mountains of facts to substantiate it.

The only thing to do with an evil is to prohibit it. The liquor traffic is an evil and must not be legalized. Prohibition for this wrong is the only sane and tenable position to take.

### Americans Pouring Into the North West.

Winnipeg, Dec 3.—Complete figures show an enormous increase in the number of immigrants arriving from the United States this year. The biggest months were April, May, June and October. The first two exceeding any of the other months by about 2,000. The figures of November have not been made up as yet. The totals for this year and last from April to October inclusive are as follows:  
1908, 65,755.  
1909, 38,844.

There has been an increase of nearly 100 per cent in every month, and in October there was an increase of more than 100 per cent.

Stockholm, Dec 5.—King Gustav inaugurated a new departure for sovereigns on Saturday. Disguised as a stevedore he spent most of the day carrying sacks of coal from a lighter. In an interview, after it was all over, the king said that this was only the beginning. He intended to mix with all classes of laborers, so that he might ascertain their opinions and wishes. Already, he added he had obtained many valuable hints from the men with whom he worked.

### How to Cleanse the Teeth.

It is more important that the teeth be cleansed thoroughly at night before retiring than at any other time. A good alkaline mouth wash should be used. Rinse it thoroughly through the mouth and force it through the teeth by means of the tongue. Hold the liquid in the mouth two or three minutes. The mouth with this treatment is put in an anti-acid condition and offsets to a large degree injury to the teeth from acids. Use a fairly stiff toothbrush.

### How to Wash Handkerchiefs Easily.

To wash handkerchiefs easily place the handkerchiefs to soak overnight in salt water that is so strong it is nearly a brine. In the morning lift the handkerchiefs out with a stick and rinse in warm water, after which it will be no task to wash them in the usual way.

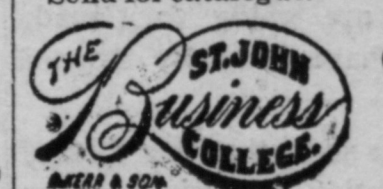
