A New and Most Promising Movement in France.

There is a group of men in France
and they are influential in the French
Government, who believe that com-
merce and the bonds which it estab-
lishes are greater than diplomacy,
and if not more potent than treaties
at least that they go before and open
the way for treaties and international
understandings of enduring value.
And as in the meantime these re-
lations prove profitable to the com-
mercial interests of both sides their
value becomes all the greater. So
these Frenchmen are devoting
themselves to the extension of com-
mercial intercourse in the conviction
that they are not only making money
for their country and showing other
people how to make it, but at the
same time doing worthy service in
the cause of peace and interna-
tional good will.

France with all her wealth and
her tremendous military establish-
ment does not want war, but while
her rank Socialists, including the
General Labor Federation, go about
encouraging the singing of the
"Internationale," "bullets in our
muskets, but only for our officers"—
these thoughtful friends of com-
merce, backed by the Radicals of
the Government and the Govern-
ment supporters in the Parliament,
are laboring to strengthen the bonds
of peace by linking the commercial,
industrial, and agricultural interests
of France and other countries to the
end that friendship may be estab-
lished, which, built upon mutual under-
standing and mutual profits, shall
cause the forces of profitable peace
to prevail over those of destructive
war. In the recent Senate elections
in France the Radicals, who support
M. Clemenceau, and who support
this movement also, won the most
widespread victory in the party's
history.
