To Remedy Andover's Water Supply.

(Victoria County News.)

DEAR SIR:

On the request of a number of the residents of Andover I last week made a thorough examination of the source of our Water Supply with a view to determine the cause of the Typhoid epidemic and to suggest some improvement. I at first thought that the cause was quite simple but after my three days investigation I find it is of a very serious nature and will remain so as long as the present conditions remain. The brook runs through cultivated fields and on one day last summer quantities of Paris Green was distributed on a number of the fields, which with Phosphate Fertilizer put in at planting made a heavy combination of poisonous matter all along the brook. On the day following the putting on of the Paris Green it commenced to rain and rained continuously for three days, thus washing about all the immense quantity of it into the brook so that for several days the water was of a strong greenish tinge. Now this would make a strong poisonous effect in the water while the essence from the Phosphate would produce the Typhoid germ.

As to a remedy I would suggest the boring for an artesian well near the reservoir, and pumping into reservoir by electric power, or moving the reservoir to the lower end of the village and taking the supply from two fine springs on the back of the Jas E Porter farm, which are well into the woods and not likely to be cultivated in the near vicinity for many years.

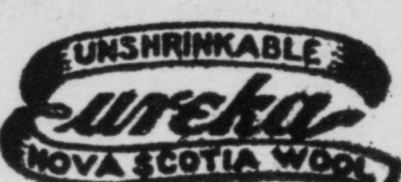
