New Temple for Pythians.

Knights of Pythias of Massachusetts are greatly interested in the proposed new Pythians Temple which, if everything goes right, will be erected in Boston in the near future.

A company has been organized under Massachusetts laws, known as the Pythian Temple Association, and is now busily engaged in selling stock.

The new building will be eight stories high. On the first floor will be stores for business purposes. On the second will be large and spacious offices for the Grand Lodge and others. The third, fourth, fifth and sixth floors will contain large halls elaborately fitted up for the use of subordinate lodges, temples for Pythian Sisters and the like. On the seventh floor will be a pool and billiard room, which will be the best in the city. There will also be reception rooms, reading, writing and smoking rooms, where any member of the order may drop in at any time and find a welcome, where he may receive his mail and have his headquarters while in the city.

The eighth floor will be used for entertainments, dancing and the like.

Good Cows In Demand.

A few days ago a buyer from the States gave the high price of two thousand dollars to a farmer near Brockville for one cow: this is believed to be the highest price ever paid for a Canadian cow. What made the animal so valuable? Granted that she was a model of beauty and an exquisite type of her breed, the fact remains that her actual performance 121 pounds of butter in 30 days. The records, those figures down in black and white, assisted in making the price. When farmers generally commence to keep records of individual cows we may hope to develop not only many more such excellent specimens, but a general improvement in the production of the average herd. Records alone can furnish the information necessary to enable intelligent selection of the promising cows, and the rejection of those that are not profitable. Such selection, coupled with more liberal feeding, will repay any farmer abundantly. As scores of farmers in Canada can testify, it has often resulted in an additional fifteen and even twenty-five dollars income per cow within four years. This means millions of dollars extra for the farmers of Ontario and Quebec, even from the present number of cows. The Dairy Commissioner, Ottawa, will be glad to supply record blanks for weights of milk, and to assist in organizing cow testing associations.
