Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency for Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years from date of homestead entry (including the required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres of extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may purchase a homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

Opal Lamp Shades Help Eyes.

If you read by artificial light use a reading lamp with an opal glass shade, open below. This should be white on the inner and green on the outer side. They may have unleashed forces which, if Prof. Lowell's theory concerning conditions on Mars is correct, may have ended forever the Martians' struggle for life.

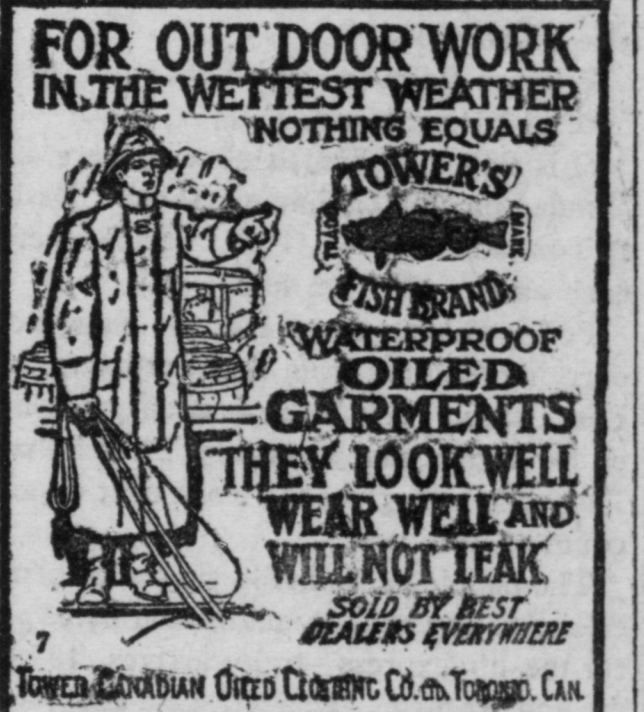
