That is how it began. When I resigned my church in Winnipeg in June, it was agreed that I should go West and find a suitable place in which we could each buy a small

I travelled through Idaho, Oregon and Washington States looking over some of the finest fruit sections of the United States. Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

A NY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son. daughter, brother or sis-

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead, Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the required to earn homestead patent)
