News in Brief.

Ti e heavy rains of last week have caused freshets of alarming proportions in the New England States. Railroad tracks have been flooded roadbeds torn up, culverts carried away and factories forced to shut down owing to the high water. The worst conditions have prevailed in New Hampshire and Vermont.

A big strike of magnetic iron ore is reported at the mouth of the Campbell River, on the east coast of Vancouver Island. Prof Hoffman, Ottawa, gauges samples running 67-47 magnetite. The discoverers say the deposits lie twenty miles back of the mouth of Campbell River. They claim that there is plenty of coal and timber for mining purposes.

The latest intelligence from German South-west Africa says that the discoveries of diamonds at Luderitz Bay are more important than was at first supposed. Diamonds heretofore have been picked up on the sandy desert, but an attempt to bore for water led to the finding of blue earth pockets containing diamonds similar to the Kimberley and other South

In connection with the Canadian National Missionary Congress, it is interesting to note, that for the year 1908, the contribution of churches in the United States and Canada to home and foreign missions increased about \$600,000, notwithstanding the financial depression in both countries and it is conceded on all sides that this increase is due to the Laymen's Missionary Movement. The Baptist Churches of Toronto in an effort to raise their share at what Toronto churches are aiming at, succeeded in raising ten per cent more than the total amount asked for, and secured \$55,000, instead of \$50,000.
