The weather during the past week extremely fine. Beats the band says an observer where all the hay and potatoes are coming from, such large quantities certainly bring in immense amounts of money as prices are remunerative and shipments made as fast as cars can be furnished.

Notwithstanding the money received by farmers in return for produce the money circulation is not materially increased being a proof that the money is hoarded to settle machinery bills, carriages and sleighs with robes, phosphate, &c. It will not take many more successful years with good markets when the farmers can take advantage of discount by buying for cash and also save an interest account. Quite a number have already arrived at the happy condition and have money to loan.

A good deal is said about the unfairness of sending money abroad to department stores. All have a right to expend their money where they can get the most for it. It does not materially help the country for a farmer in Knowlsville to spend his money in Hartland or Glassville and give it to the dealers in those places the benefit of his patronage. The merchant will send it away with the profit he has made out of the farmer and he (the merchant) is benefitted. There is reason to believe that profits have been pretty good, to say the least of it, for there are many proofs all through the country that persons in business only a comparatively short time have made more property than the former mechanic or laborer could have accumulated in a reasonable life time. Of late there is an improvement. Goods are sold at a less profit and judging by the reduced price sales going on at John T. G. Carr's and other places customers have but little cause for fault finding. The cash system is being inaugurated which will be far better for both parties the buyers and the sellers. Formerly the merchant carried the farmer over year to year and a larger profit was necessary, unless the merchant possessed unlimited capital. He in order to carry out such system and keep up his stock would be compelled to hire money and pay interest for it. The merchant must pay for his goods at specified periods. Here is a note or draft in the bank and after before 3 o'clock upon the day it is due, it must be

paid or his name is dishonored, his credit is gone and business closed by writ of attachment or assignment. His creditor will not accept the excuses, hard times, money scarce, have been sick and sickness in my family, others have disappointed me and I cannot pay. No, they simply say I want my money.
