Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister or intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm at least 20 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

## Local Legislature.

(Continued from last week.)  
The appropriation for fish, forest and game protection this year was \$28,000. He recognized that the increasing importance of this matter made necessary larger and larger grants each succeeding year. He did not criticize this item, but thought the people of the country would feel easier if the surveyor-general gave assurance that the officials of the crown land department would be available at any and all times to protect the forests and that they could feel that the crown land department was back of them and working with them when fire was sweeping through the forests, no matter if on private property. He trusted that the surveyor-general would give this assurance and give specific instructions to officials of his department in that regard.

The appropriation for immigration was \$5,660. That was the outset of a new policy. A systematic effort was to be made to bring out people to settle upon the vacant lands of the province. It was not a large expenditure, not large enough to accomplish very much good, he was afraid. He thought the farming class of Great Britain was not the kind of immigrants this province needed. Conditions were so different in this province from what these people were used to that generally they did not amount to much after they settled here and he feared not much could be expected from the government's new immigration movement.

If some way could be advised to keep our young men at home that would be far better than all immigration policies any government could devise. He believed in colonization rather than immigration, and thought money could be better expended for such purposes. I was very unfortunate that every year so many young men go west never to return. It is made easy for them to leave the province. Was it not possible to keep these young men here? If so, there was no more patriotic work this government could engage in. He would call the attention of the government to the splendid colonization lands being made accessible by the building of the Transcontinental railway. The government would find it was the policy of the C P Railway to induce immigrants to go to the far west, because of the increased fares they got from them. Those were some of the problems the government would have to face.

He regretted to find no provision was made for a sinking fund to provide for obligations the province was incurring. When, in 1907, the old government ascertained the province was to have an extra \$130,000 as a dominion subsidy, they decided to set aside each year \$30,000 as a sinking fund, which it was calculated would in fifty years entirely wipe out the provincial debt. Such a policy was wise and appealed to the sound and sane business judgment of the country. He did not see that the present government proposed to carry out the policy of their predecessors in that regard, which he sincerely regretted.

The same thing would apply to a bond issue, and he thought provision should be made that all bonds issued for steel bridges and other permanent works should have a sinking fund attached, so that by the time those structures were worn out money would be at hand to pay for them. In an annual sinking fund to provide for the payment of the public debt and in meeting bond issues when due lay the pathway to provincial solvency. And without such sound financing the government and country was only laying up trouble for the future.

He noticed in the estimates that \$6,000 was expected from school books. It was presumed the government estimated that every vendor would pay back in full all he got from the sale of books, and that the total would be \$6,000. There were in the province about 60,000 pupils in the public schools which means that each pupil will have invested ten cents in school books, and yet this government takes great credit to itself for the enormous saving to the people on account of its school book policy. The people and legislature should stand with bared heads and bated breath when they contemplated the great saving made by this government on a ten-cent investment of every school child. The public was master and would carefully look after the conduct of its servants. If they had done well it would reward them, if ill it would visit on them the wrath they deserved.

This government came into power upon a platform of fine promises, but it had become the laughing stock of the country. The people of the province were alive to the situation and would insist that these gentlemen keep the pledges and promises by which they had attained power.

Coming to agriculture he noticed that no less a sum than \$44,556 was put down under that heading. When he noticed this he concluded that the government was actuated by laudable motives which reflected the sentiment of the people. Compared with \$21,987 appropriated last year he thought with \$44,556 allotted this year agriculture was at last coming into its own.

His disappointment was great when he found that of this amount \$6,000 was coming out for expenses of the agricultural commission. That might be all right if they only knew what it was for. This would bring the appropriation down to \$38,000. Looking further into the matter \$10,000 had come off for exhibitions. The provincial secretary had taken great credit for the government's liberality to agriculture, but when the various amounts came to be deducted from it there would be very little more left than was granted by the old government.

The house took recess.  
Mr. McKeown, continuing after recess said the loss on horse, sheep and seed importations of 1907 was \$9,399, which, he thought, was a just gift or bonus to agriculturists and could rightly be credited in the appropriation for agriculture, so that all told agriculture, was given about \$500 more last year than is being asked for in 1909.

Turning to the items of expenditure, it was found that the expenses

of the auditor-general's department had been increased \$650, notwithstanding these gentlemen when in opposition promised economy and retrenchment. The same was true of the education department. He did not say these increases were unnecessary, perhaps they were advisable; he only called attention to them to show the insincerity of these gentlemen when they promised to decrease expenditure.

Special attention will be given to various phases of practical Christian work under the direction of Rev H W Pope. Open air, tent and gospel wagon meetings will be held daily. An opportunity is thus afforded pastors and theological students to get a thorough training in practical methods in Christian service.
