### LOCAL LEGISLATURE.

(Continued from last week.)

MR. ROBINSON'S INDICTMENT.

Hon. Mr. Robinson's motion, seconded by Mr. Currie, of which notice is given on Monday, is as follows:

Whereas, it has been shown by return of the chief commissioner of public works laid upon the table of the house in answer to inquiry by Mr. Tweeddale, the amount of \$94,750.22 has been paid out since the close of the past fiscal year, ending October 31, 1908, in the ordinary maintenance of roads and bridges of the province, of which almost \$51,711.73 was applied to the maintenance of bridges, and \$43,038.49 was applied to maintenance of roads;

And whereas, said amount of \$94,750.22 was paid largely, if not entirely, for work done and materials supplied previous to the said 31st day of October, 1908, and represents an over-expenditure for the said fiscal year;

And whereas, by special legislation the government has increased the permanent debt of the province by charging to capital account the sum of \$215,781.40 to provide for public works and other expenditures accrued previous to the change of government, thereby affording them the opportunity of commencing the operations of the past fiscal year with a clean sheet, so that there could be no excuse for expending in that year more money than was appropriated by this legislature.

And whereas, there is good ground for the belief that further large sums expended in said last fiscal year have not yet been paid, which will swell the over-expenditure to an amount which will greatly exceed the sum of \$100,000, all of which belongs to the said last fiscal year.

Whereby the report of the auditor general for the past fiscal year, showing an apparent surplus of \$44,541.85 is entirely misleading and incomplete and it appears on the contrary that there really was a deficit to a very large extent, notwithstanding the fact that the revenues of the province were very materially augmented by the increased subsidy of \$130,000 from the dominion government and by the rapid growth of the territorial revenue.

And whereas, the present government obtained the confidence of the electors of this province upon this province upon their professions of economy and their oft-repeated pledges to keep the ordinary expenditure of the province within the ordinary revenue.

Therefore resolved, that in the opinion of this house the government during their first year in the management of the financial affairs of this province is guilty of violation of the pledges of economy, and a breach of faith with the electors of this province in neglecting to carry out in practice the principles which were promulgated by them when in opposition to the government of the day, and have thereby forfeited their right to carry on and conduct the business of the people of this province.

HIGHWAY ACT JAMMED THROUGH.

The following resolutions were moved before the third reading of the highway act. They were all voted down by a vote of 27 to 13. The only absentee on the opposition side was Mr. LaBillois, Mr. Burchill was also absent. Dr. Taylor, Messrs. Glasier and Cyr were absent on the government side. Moved by Mr. Upham, seconded by Mr. Leger, Westmorland:

"Resolved, That the bill be referred back with instructions to amend the provisions therein contained for the appointment of the secretary-treasurer of the highway boards, to provide that the secretary-treasurer be appointed by the county councils."

Moved by Mr. Lowell, seconded by Mr. McKeown:

"Resolved, That bill No 85 be not now read a third time but be referred back to amend the same as to provide that in the county of St. John the said act shall not apply but that the road law, as it exists in said county of St. John at the present time, be continued."

Moved by Dr. Sormany, seconded by Mr. Leger (Gloucester):

"Resolved, That the bill be referred back with instructions to amend the provisions therein contained for the payment of road tax in cash, so that those who do not desire to perform statute labor and will pay their tax in cash within ten days after the day appointed by the surveyor for the payment of the same will be allowed a discount of five per cent of the amount of said tax."

Moved by Mr. Tweeddale, seconded by Mr. Burgess:

"Resolved, That the bill be referred back with instructions to amend the same in accordance with the promises of the present government when in opposition by providing that the amount of the provincial grant, after having been apportioned by the government among the different counties of the province, shall be paid by the chief

commissioner of public works to the county councils of the different municipalities. That in the apportionment of said grant among the different counties it shall be the duty of the government to so apportion it so as to provide that the amount payable to each county shall not be less than the amount which was paid by the late government to each county."

Moved by C. M. Leger, seconded by Mr. Currie:

"Resolved, That the bill be referred back with instructions to amend the provisions therein contained for fixing the minimum tax so that the minimum rate shall be twelve cents on \$100 and \$1 poll tax."

As a contrast of the differences in the treatment accorded to the "interests" as compared with the working men by Mr. Hazen and his government, there never was a better example than was furnished when the St. John River Log Driving Co's act came up for a third reading.

This act was amended on its passage through the house in a manner totally different from what was arranged previously. One of the finest rows of the session took place over the passage of the amendment which, it is asserted, was changed at the request of a member of the government, who disappeared from his seat when the bill came up for reconsideration.

The promptitude with which Mr. Hazen came to the rescue of his colleague in Sunbury—Mr. Glasier—who had charge of the bill, and changed the wording of the amendment to suit the "interests," was amazing, but it was done just the same and the objectionable features eliminated.

A thief stole the mail bags at Dalhousie one night last week. One of the bags contained the registered mail among which was a parcel of \$2,000 being sent from Dalhousie to St. John. Up to the present no arrests have been made.

Ontario was visited with a regular winter blizzard last week. In some place a foot of snow fell.

During 1908, 23,295, natives of Ireland left the Emerald Isle, the lowest number in any year recorded. This is at the rate of 5.3 per 1,000, the lowest rate recorded being 7. Between May 1, 1851, when the enumeration was commenced, in Dec. 31, 1908, the total emigration almost equaled the present population of the country. The emigrants during the 57 years numbered 4,126,310, while the estimated population at the middle of 1908 was 4,371,436. 72.4 per cent of the emigrants went to the United States. Over 33 per cent of the male emigrants of 15 years of age and upwards were described as "laborers," and 67 per cent of the women emigrants as "servants."
