A return tabled in parliament shows that for the two decades-1888 to 1908-exclusive of the Canadian Pacific, Grand Trunk, Canadian Northern and Grank Trunk Pacific, charters have been granted for the construction of 63,809, miles of railway in Canada. Of 203 companies incorporated only twenty-five have constructed any portion of the railways authorized, and 86 charters have lapsed. Eighty-eight charters have been given one extension of time, forty-two have received two extensions, and eighteen three extentions, or more. Since 1900, 117 charters have been granted, of which twenty-six have already lipsed.

Synopsis of Canadian North-

west Land Regulations ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may home stead a quarter-section of available Domin ion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Al-The applicant must appear in at the Dominion Lands agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead, Price \$3.00 per aere. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (include ing the required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a preemption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Dut-les-Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
