Go Preachers in Bad Repute.

Moncton, N. B., Sept 28—(Special)—It is possible that the provincial authorities may be given charge of matters in connection with "Go Preachers," whose headquarters are said to be at George, near Moncton, and concerning whom startling complaints have been received by the local police from England, alleging that the "Go Preachers" have induced many young girls in the old country to leave their homes and afterwards ensnared them into lives of shame.

Circulars received here from England quote some startling incidents, and the local police are in further communication with the English authorities, after which the matter may be handed over to the attorney general.

There is a good deal of excitement in some rural communities near Moncton where "Go Preachers" have been at work, and in some cases it is reported that domestic infelicities and family divisions have followed in the wake of the preachers' visits, some hearers being aroused to a high pitch of religious fervor, and contributing freely to the cause.

One woman had a child christened three times in one day, and another buried a valuable fur coat and gold watch in her zeal to follow the teachings of the sect. The police here are going to investigate many rumors afloat.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier.

The Toronto Telegram in making a reference to Sir Wilfrid Laurier as a small and petty tyrant, who is bigoted, intolerant and unjust, says that

"Canada never had a premier more prone than Sir Wilfrid Laurier to rest content with the undoubted cleanness of his own hands and life."

One of Sir Wilfrid Laurier's chief characteristics is his tolerance, perfect fairness and lack of bigotry. His whole life has been devoted to the task of cementing the races in harmony and cementing self-respect. In this he has earned the unstinted support of both races in Canada. The tribute to the integrity of his personal life and public record was unnecessary. The man is unborn who can charge Sir Wilfrid with a dishonest or unjust act throughout his official life. The advent of Sir Wilfrid Laurier to the premiership was not only the dawn of great material prosperity for Canada, but the dawn of a day of higher ideal, of most robust and nobler ambition, and national uplift in every way.

Over a Million Settlers.

The annual report of the immigration branch of the interior department states that during the last fiscal year the number of arrivals was 146,908, of whom 62,901 came from Great Britain and Ireland, 34,175 from other countries, and 59,832 from the United States.

While this total showed a big fall off from the previous year, it was exceeded only once before in the dozen years. The total immigration since 1896-7 has been 1,366,650. Stress is laid upon the fact that nearly half of the male population which arrived last year was composed of farmers and farm laborers.

The immigration from the United States was the largest on record and even exceeded the number of arrivals from Great Britain. They are chiefly experienced agriculturists with capital. Practically 60,000 Americans entered Canada and every man, woman and child was possessed on an average of \$1,000 in stock, cash and effects, meaning that they brought into Canada very nearly \$60,000,000.

Opening Of Nova Scotia's Exhibition.

Halifax, Sept. 27.—Instead of the formal opening of the provincial exhibition in front of the grand stand on Saturday afternoon there was a luncheon in the administration building. Mr Justice Longley presided. Near him were Governor Fraser, Senators Ross and MacKeen, Hon O P Chisholm, E A MacDonald, M P; Mayor Chisholm, of Halifax, and Mayor Notting, of Dartmouth; Messrs Tiffin and Brady, Rev Messrs Newcombe, MacMillan, D B Heron and Pennoyer, members of the executive commission.

New Brunswick is well represented in the live stock buildings, there being some fine horses, cattle and sheep from the sister province. B. Goodwin, of Westmorland, N. B., has a fine exhibit of Oxford Down and Leicester sheep. H C Jewett has six fine horses, mostly Clydes.

The vandale features have been eliminated and there will be no night performance.

The attendance on Saturday was nearly 4,000.
