Winnipeg, Manitoba.

It is learned that the Grand Trunk Pacific—Canada's new transcontinental railway—has decided to build a city at Melville, Sask., for its western headquarters.

Thirty years ago the Canadian Pacific R.R. adopted Winnipeg as its western headquarters and now the Grand Trunk Pacific is creating Melville. This new railway has acquired property at that town and is now engaged in laying out yards which will be the largest between Winnipeg and the Pacific Coast. The Hudson's Bay line of the Grand Trunk Pacific will end at Melville at which point European immigrants and freight will be distributed over the lines of the company. The Chief Dispatcher, Superintendent and other head officials of the western lines of the company are now located at Melville where the company intends to build up a large city. Melville is named after Charles Melville Hays, President of the company.

Already the plans of the company have become known in certain quarters and the Dominion Bank wishing a site on which to build was obliged to pay \$2500 for a 25 foot lot, which is considered a big price for property in a pioneer town even though it has the prospects of Melville.

In April, construction will be commenced on two branch lines from Melville, one northward to Hudson's Bay and the other southward to the American boundary to connect with transcontinental systems to the south of the line near North Portal.

C M Sherwood, Centreville, has landed another lot of "White Eye" Seed Wheat, grown along the border of Ontario and Manitoba, near the "Lake of the Woods" Milling Co Mills. The introduction of this variety of Manitoba hard wheat during the past three years has been more than satisfactory. The hull of this variety is exceedingly thin, leaving a maximum amount of high grade bread flour, besides more bread per lb of flour used—conditions not possible with the different grades of soft wheat formerly grown here. To encourage the cultivation of better wheat, this seed, although high priced, is being sold at net cost.

SEATTLE, WASHINGTON.

On March 1st, the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition, which is to open in Seattle on June 1st, was within ten percent of being a finished product. All of the splendid structures erected by the Exposition corporation were finished and ready for the exhibits which they are to house, and the staff work and last bits of ornamentation being put on the structures built by the United States Government to cover the exhibits from Alaska, Hawaii the Philippines, the fisheries and the national capital.

The scores of acres of gardens comprehended in the magnificent landscaping scheme are already breaking into leaf and, in many cases brilliant bloom so that by the opening day the whole grounds will be a riot of color such as has been seen at no other world's fair.

Exhibits are beginning to arrive by the boat and train load.

The last two steamships from the Alaskan coast brought little of anything save portions of the government's Alaskan display. Not the least interesting item on the shipping bills was \$5,000,000 in gold dust, just as it was taken out of the placer mines of the Yukon, Tanana and Nome districts. All of this vast amount of wealth was brought out from the camps by dog teams over the winter trails, travelling by this typically Alaskan method, in some cases, as much as 1,500 miles with no other guard than the "musher" who drove the malamutes.

The chief construction now going forward on the grounds is being done upon state buildings. Michigan has recently begun on its handsome club house and is rushing it to completion. The Illinois Society of the Northwest is similarly engaged and Utah and Nevada are among late comers. Oregon has added \$25,000 to its original appropriation of \$100,000 and promises greatly to extend its exhibit.

The live stock show, which originally was planned as a coast affair, has grown to such proportions that it will be as large as any ever held in the country. Demands for entry are pouring in from Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, Ohio and neighboring states and the original area of 700 by 300 feet, which was to have been covered, has been enlarged to an area 1000 by 1000 feet.

Rapid progress is being made on Canadian building and the exhibit of our neighbor to the North will be very comprehensive and attractive. There will be 85 dancing men and women in the Turkish Village of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition which opens on June 1 in Seattle, making it the biggest oriental concession put on at any Exposition.

Tourists bound for the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition, which opens in Seattle in June, will have a splendid opportunity to take the world's famous summer excursion along the glaciers and mountains of the Alaska coast.

The Seattle chamber of commerce will conduct an information bureau in Seattle while the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition is in progress for the benefit of visitors to the city. Agents will meet all boats and trains and in this way persons who visit the metropolis of the state of Washington this summer will be assured of reasonable rates at the hotels and lodging houses.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 50 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$50.00.
