ynopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations

ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Persons must reside upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

Pumpkin Soup.

To very little water in which dissolved two lumps of sugar and enough salt add good slice of pumpkin, varying the size for the quantity desired. Boil until the pumpkin is reduced to a puree the consistency of soft apple sauce. Remove and add a large lump of butter, whipped quickly into the pumpkin, pepper to taste and add rich cream to the desired thickness.

It will probably take four cents' worth of cream to one-sixteenth of a moderate sized pumpkin.

A little crooked vermicelli may be used as a thickener.

Care must be taken not to mase the soup too thin.

How to Make Pumpkin Pie.

To a quart of stewed pumpkin, drained and well mashed, add one cupful of sugar, two eggs, well beaten, two tablespoonfuls of cornstarch, mixed with the sugar; half a teaspoonful each of cinnamon and allspice, quarter of a teaspoonful of cloves and of nutmeg. Mix all together. Heat until boiling hot a pint of milk, pour it over the pumpkin and let stand until cool, stirring well. Line four pie tins with good, rich crust: fill with the mixture but do not cover with an upper crust. Bake in a moderately hot oven.

How to Prepare Boned Turkey.

Boil the fowl in as little water as possible until the bones can easily be separated from the meat. Remove all of the skin, slice and mix together the light and dark parts, prepare a dressing as for roast turkey, put upon the fire to melt the butter, then mould into a round ball and put the meat all around it. Boil down the liquid in which the turkey or chicken was boiled, then pour it on the meat. Wrap it tightly in a cloth, then press it with a heavy weight for a few hours. When served it is cut into thin slices.

Hominy Fritters.

Sift together one cupful of flour, one teaspoonful of salt and two spoonfuls of baking powder. Mix with this one pint of cold boiled hominy, using a fork to break the latter fine.

Add one well beaten egg and sufficient milk to make a very thick batter. Drop by spoonfuls into a kettle partly filled with smoking hot fat.

Turn as they rise, and when golden brown all over skim out and drain on unglazed paper.

Sponge Cake Apple Pudding.

A good apple pudding is two cups of finely quartered apples, one cup stale sponge cake crumbs, one tablespoonful butter. Put in alternative layers. Pour the melted butter over and bake in a moderate oven until apples are soft.

Remove from oven.

Make a custard of one cup milk, one egg, one-fourth cup sugar. Pour over the pudding and return to oven to set the custard.
