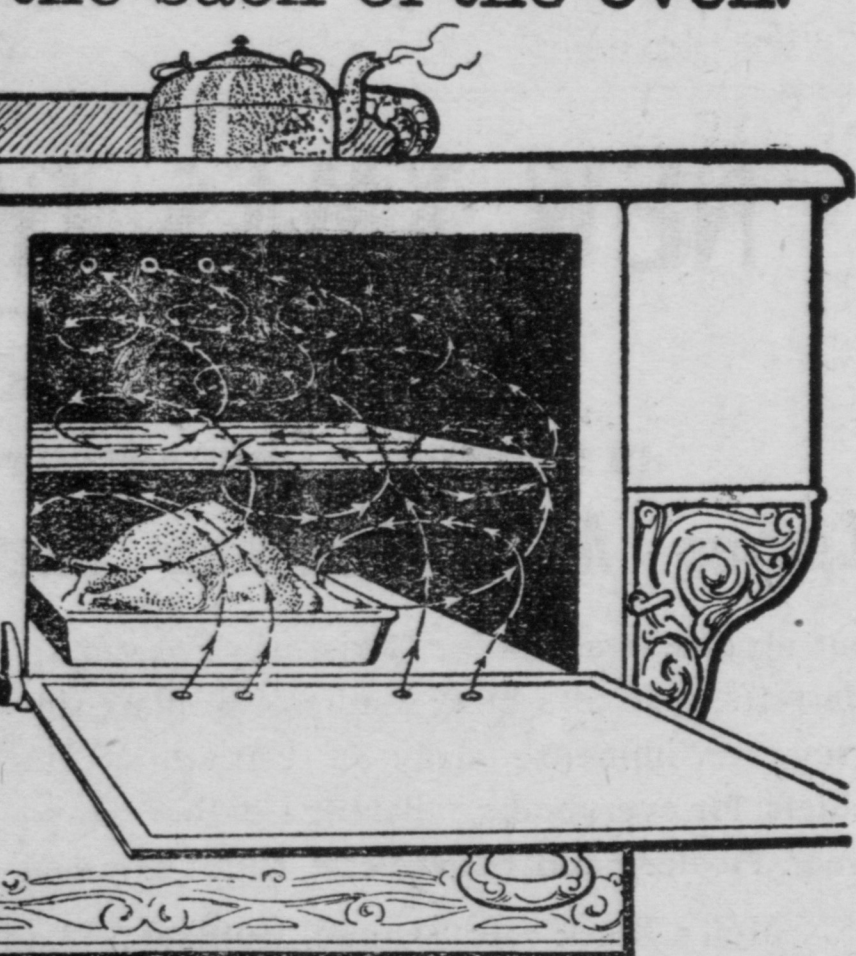

London, Dec. 4.—In the midst of its budget troubles the British Government is today racking its brains to find a suitable man for the job of Viceroy of India. Since the last attempt against the life of the Earl of Minto there has not been much competition among peers for the appointment. The general opinion is that it is a bit too risky.

Lord Minto's term of office would expire naturally at the end of next year, but he finds that the continual fear of attacks on his life is telling on his wife's health, and he would by no means be sorry to relinquish the post a little earlier.

The Liberals would like to have another of their own men in for five years, in case they lose the general election, but the vice-regal throne is not a bed of roses just now, and society ladies—it is generally the wife who covets the glories of Government House, Calcutta—do not relish the idea of being a mark for bombs.
