PALATIAL HOME FOR SANITARIUM.

MRS. J. C. JORDAN'S OFFER OF HER \$50,000 ALBERT COUNTY HOME TO BE ACCEPTED.

It is understood that the report of the anti-tuberculosis commission has been received by the Provincial Government and that it recommends the acceptance of the offer of Mrs. James C. Jordan, widow of the deceased millionaire, son of Eben Jordan, of the firm of Jordan & Marsh, Boston, offering her beautiful \$50,000 home at River Glade, Albert county, for a tuberculosis hospital.

Mrs. Jordan was formerly Miss Stiles of Albert County, and owned a beautiful summer residence at River Glade, about five miles from Petiteville and Salisbury. When her husband died he left her upwards of \$1,000,000, as well as the large amount of property he had given her during his life time. The beautiful summer home is admirably suited for a tuberculosis sanitarium and legislation will probably be passed at the approaching session of the legislature for conducting the institution and it will probably be opened as a sanitarium for tuberculosis patients in the early summer season of 1911.

FREE TRADE RELATIONS WITH THE UNITED STATES.

Under the heading of "A GREAT OPPORTUNITY," the Toronto Sun, our Independent Weekly Journal, says:—

"The farmers of Ontario have an opportunity open to them now such as has not existed before in a generation. President Taft is anxious to arrange for free trade between Canada and the United States, and has already opened negotiations looking in this direction. The late elections in the United States show that the American people are with him in his desire. The organized farmers of the West are going to send a train load of delegates to Ottawa next month to urge the demand that American overtures looking to reciprocity be met half way by the Dominion Government. If Ontario farmers send an equal number of delegates, to act with the Western men, the battle for free trade will be won. But if Ontario is to send such a number instant action in every section of the Province, looking to the appointment of delegates, is absolutely necessary.

The door to the American market is now waiting to be opened. If we fail to take advantage of the present situation we may not in many years to come have another opportunity such as is presented to-day."

The St. John City Council has passed a resolution asking the Federal Government to nationalize the harbour, and authorized the Mayor to name a committee to interview the Government on the subject.

An important statement indicating the steadily growing importance of St. John in relation to Canadian transportation was made in the confirmation of the rumour press last week. One was the confirmation of the rumour that the Canadian Pacific Company had decided to establish lines of steamers to South America and the West Indies, the former to have St. John as their winter port, and the latter, for which special steamers must be built, to run to St. John all the year round. The South American

service, it is stated, will be begun in 1911.

The Cuban Steamship Service is doing a good business this season. The steamer Leuctra, which sailed last week, included in her cargo 22,725 barrels of potatoes, 22,550 bushels of oats, 1,257 cases of condensed cream, and a large quantity of lumber, hay and other merchandise.
